

TRANSIT?

Why study transit in this corridor?

- (re)Development throughout the corridor
- Access to major job centers -Mall of America, MSP Airport, Saint Paul
- Improve mobility within the Riverview Corridor and to connecting transit routes
- Connect major transportation hubs -Mall of America, MSP Airport, Union Depot





- Percent of transit-reliant population: higher than regional averages
- Diverse population with a variety of transportation needs

How does the corridor compare to the county and region?


(2010)	Corridor (Half Mile Buffer)	Ramsey County	Twin Cities MSA


Overview of Implementation Process
