



## Emerald Ash Borer Management Program

One or more public property ash trees have been identified adjacent to your property which have previously been treated for EAB via a City administered program. The following information is an important update on upcoming changes in the City's treatment program. Public property trees treated in 2020 and 2021 by the City have already received their final treatment. Trees last treated in 2019 will receive one final City administered treatment in 2022

Please note: this change only applies to trees treated by the City and will not impact any public ash tree already being treated on a regular interval by the adjacent property owner via the established permitting process.

## **PUBLIC PROPERTY ASH TREE NOTICE:**

If the ash tree adjacent to your property has previously been treated by the City it will have a metal tag on the trunk — "ST PAUL EAB YEAR". As the adjacent property owner you have the option to take over that treatment regimen through Forestry's permitting process. Permit applications for treatment must be submitted by <u>May 1st, 2022</u> to be considered for approval. These trees will otherwise be added to the existing EAB management plan for removal and replacement. Removals will take place in 2023 or 2024 with replanting to follow.
