Firefight/EMT Written Exam is scheduled for **June 1**, **2018**. See more information below.

Candidates must submit an online job application **and** an application fee of \$50. Economic hardship waivers will be available for those who qualify. The application fee does not apply to City of Saint Paul residents. Applicants must live in the City limits and submit proof of residency in order to have the fee waived.
