All In! Recycling Changes: By now, hopefully you are ALL IN to Saint Paul's new recycling program. No sorting and more recyclable items means recycling is easier than ever. Recycling helps reduce waste in our landfills and keeps the cost of trash collection and processing down. For now, place all recyclables in your blue bin. Citywide Clean-Ups: For bulky waste and recyclables, the City of Saint Paul and District Councils have partnered to host six citywide cleanup events in 2014. Properly dispose of items such as furniture and construction materials at a reasonable cost and recycle items like mattresses, appliances, electronics, and scrap metal. Plus, residents may donate usable household items for reuse. All cleanups are open to all Saint Paul residents. Dale Street Traffic

With the support of Saint Paul Public Works, Ramsey County is proposing to restripe Dale Street between Larpenteur and Front from four to three lanes this summer. The street would include traffic lanes in each direction plus a center lane for left turns. The proposed conversion is expected to reduce speeding on Dale (which is very residential) and improve safety for vehicles and pedestrians alike. A public meeting will be held on Wednesday, May 28 from 6-7:30pm at North Dale Rec Center. Find more information and a comment form here.

After the long winter, I am so happy to be on a bike again (kudos to those who brave our wintery streets on two wheels!). Biking is one of my passions and I love biking to work downtown or along the beautiful Gateway Trail and other recreational bikeways throughout the metro (watch for my published article in this years' Saint Paul Almanac warning my fellow cyclists of my competitive spirit). I am also excited about the new Nice Ride station at Como Lake, making biking accessible to all of our neighbors!

Ward 5 has good access to bike and pedestrian amenities and the City of Saint Paul is poised to make major improvements for biking and connections city-wide through the new Bikeways Plan. Hopefully, you have learned more about the plan at one of the many open houses. If not, you can view a draft at www.stpaul.gov/bikeplan and offer comments at future public hearings. In addition to improving and connecting the Grand Round on Wheelock Parkway, the Bike Plan proposes separated bikeways, enhanced road sharing and more safe, separated crossings throughout the Ward. New bicycle facilities are also coming to the neighborhood in the Trout Brook Regional Trail (opening 2015 as part of the Trout Brook Nature Sanctuary) and improved connections along I-35E, coming as part of the I-
