CIB Proposal for Central District Police Station

The Saint Paul Police Department is seeking funding from the bi-annual Capital Improvement Budget (CIB) process this year to return the Central District Station to the North End. The Central Police District serves the North End, Downtown and the West Side. Unlike the Western and Eastern Districts--which have their own communitybased stations--the Central District is squeezed into the City and County Law Enforcement Headquarters. The Central District is eager to relocate from what was supposed to be a temporary location into a more community-focused and districtaccessible location. Community volunteers, who recognize the benefits of having a police presence back in the neighborhood, have gathered over 1,000 petition signatures in support of the proposed station.

Ward 5 Featured Artist: Mica Lee Anders

The latest installment in the Ward 5 City Council office comes from Mica Anders, an artist and educator who works with area youth through COMPAS and the East Side Arts Council. She has conducted Arts in Residence and programs at Rice Rec and North Dale Rec and is currently working with students at McDonough Rec Center. Mica received her Masters of Fine Arts degree from the University of Minnesota. Her work focuses primarily on the mixed-race experience and is based on her perspectives as a biracial woman.

The Heraldic Geneagraph series is made up of several fabric wall hangings, each assembled in the shape of a heraldic shield, quilted and embellished with symbols to emphasize historical and cultural elements in her subjects' ethic/racial family genealogy. Each piece in this series is based in specific historical traditions, both in terms of design and content. $\begin{bmatrix} y_i \\ y_i \end{bmatrix}$ The traditional artistic practices that I drew upon most were European heraldry, West African textile design, American quilting and Cherokee beading. I used these artistic traditions to guide my design choices regarding shape, lines of division, fabric color and pattern and symbolic references.

District Council Boundary Change Moves Forward

A community meeting in January to discuss the proposed change to the District Council boundary between District 6 and District 10 was attended by over 170 residents. Further input was solicited through the online Open Saint Paul forum. Ultimately, the District Councils as well as the City's Planning and Economic Development department supported a change that would move the entire South Como neighborhood from District 6 to District 10. A Resolution making the boundary change official, effective January 1, 2014, will be heard by the City Council in coming weeks. The Resolution will also initiate a review of the process to change District Council boundaries moving forward.
