Asian Economic Base in Saint Paul - 2007

- 364 million dollars in buying power *
- 1262 firms with 172 million dollars in sales. 178 of these firms had paid employees employing 1773 people with an annual payroll of \$31 million.**
- In the Twin Cities MSA: **
 - 6604 firms with \$1.6 billion in sales. 1494 firms had employees.
- Industries where Asian American firms are found in Minnesota: professional services, health care, retail trade, hospitality and food services and real estate,
- 53 percent own their homes*
- 8 percent use public transportation to work.
- 84 percent own one or more vehicles*
- 2 million dollars in rent #
- 3 million dollars in real estate taxes#
- 37 million dollars in state and local taxes*
- 52.6 percent with a high school degree or more. 31 percent have a education levels higher than high school#
- 36,701 people or 14 percent of the population*
