Burns Play Area Analysis and Programming Meeting Notes – December 8, 2011 Progressive Baptist Church

### **Meeting Attendees:**

Community Members –Lawrence Sagstetter, Lisa May, and Timothy Cameron. Parks and Recreation Staff - Bill Pesek, David Ronzani, and Linda Flynn.

- A. David Ronzani of Parks and Recreation passed out the meeting agenda.
- B. David Ronzani gave a brief review of the October Meeting.

# C. David Ronzani presented the concept design based on input provided from the October Meeting.

- a. Maintain existing concrete and majority of the play curbs.
- b. Play surface to be a combination of poured in place rubber and sand.
- c. Combine traditional/modern styles or a net climber into main play structure.
- d. Provide a screen of vegetation along the east side fence.
- e. Update site furnishings.
- f. Historical marker.
- g. Drinking fountain if funds allow.

## D. David Ronzani presented sample playground layouts from several manufacturers. Committee Recommendations are as follows:

- a. Committee's Structure Preference Layout Option #1 Traditional with Net Climber.
- b. Highlights:
  - i. Positive reaction to all of the layouts. Option #1 stood out as the most positive overall feel with a larger rope climber attached to a larger dedicated traditional structure.
  - ii. Would like to see double slide incorporated if possible, and another spinning element.
  - iii. Connectivity within the structure to a variety of components.
- c. Committee's Preferences for Independent Events Overall
  - i. Would like to see a spinning events like the "comet" incorporated.
  - ii. Double posted "tot" swing incorporated into the rubber surface if possible.
  - iii. Seated spinners.
- d. Sand Area Play Components Preferences Overall





- i. Include a sand play table, or include equipment with surfaces that sand can be placed on.
- ii. Include spring toys.
- iii. Include 2 diggers total (1 ADA accessible).
- iv. Saddle spinner.
- v. Additional tot orientated elements where they fit.

### e. Furnishings

- i. Update Benches.
- ii. Picnic Table to match benches.
- iii. Drinking Fountain If funding allows.
- iv. Update bike rack.

#### f. Colors

- i. Play equipment
  - 1. Purples, yellows and bright primary colors that make the play area stand out.
- ii. Surfacing
  - 1. Poured in Place rubber, lighter matrix of color.
- iii. Furnishings
  - 1. To match play equipment.

#### **E.** Discussion/Comments/Questions:

- a. Consider Grand Reopening event to coincide with National Night Out, August 2012.
- b. Incorporate an element that describes the park's history. (Proposal initiated by a community member whose mother grew up on the property.)
- c. Repair bituminous pathway on the north end of the park (if funding allows).

#### F. Next Steps:

- a. Play equipment layout refinement, construction document and specification development, advertise for bids, construction.
- b. Tentative early spring construction 2012.
- c. Action Items:
  - i. Website to be updated throughout the construction process.
