9 10 WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Livable Communities Act (Minnesota Statutes sections 473.25 to 473.255) establishes a Metropolitan Livable Communities Fund which is intended to address housing and other development issues facing the metropolitan area defined by Minnesota Statutes section 473.121; and

11 WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Livable Communities Fund, comprising the Tax Base Revitalization Account, the Livable Communities Demonstration Account, the Local Housing Incentive Account and the Inclusionary Housing Account, is intended to provide certain funding and other assistance to metropolitan-14 area municipalities; and

WHEREAS, a metropolitan-area municipality is not eligible to receive grants or loans under the 16 Metropolitan Livable Communities Fund or eligible to receive certain polluted sites cleanup funding from the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development unless the municipality is participating in the Local Housing Incentives Account Program under Minnesota Statutes section 473.254; 20 and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Livable Communities Act requires the Metropolitan Council to negotiate with each municipality to establish affordable and life-cycle housing goals for that municipality that are consistent with and promote the policies of the Metropolitan Council as provided in the adopted 25 Metropolitan Development Guide; and

WHEREAS, currently the Metropolitan Council categorizes a housing unit as affordable if it is affordable 27 28 to a household earning less than or equal to 60 percent of the area median family income and where unit costs represent no more than a particular percentage of a household budget determined affordable by the 30 US Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

32 WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Council defines lifecycle housing as providing varied housing options that 33 meet people's preferences and circumstances at all of life's stages, providing a balance of single-family 34 homes, apartments, condominiums, townhomes, and senior housing for independent living or with a range 35 of assisted-living services; and

WHEREAS, previously negotiated affordable and life-cycle housing goals for municipalities participating 37 38 in the Local Housing Incentives Account Program expire in 2010; and

40 WHEREAS, the housing goals indicated below are consistent with the previously-identified goals in Saint 41 Paul's Housing Chapter of the Comprehensive Plan, adopted by the City Council and the Metropolitan

42 Council; and

WHEREAS, a metropolitan-area municipality can participate in the Local Housing Incentives Account Program under Minnesota Statutes section 473.254 if: (a) the municipality elects to participate in the Local Housing Incentives Program; (b) the Metropolitan Council and the municipality successfully negotiate new affordable and life-cycle housing goals for the municipality; (c) the Metropolitan Council adopts by resolution the new negotiated affordable and life-cycle housing goals for the municipality; and (d) the municipality establishes it has spent or will spend or distribute to the Local Housing Incentives Account the required Affordable and Life-Cycle Housing Opportunities Amount (ALHOA) for each year the municipality participates in the Local Housing Incentives Account Program.
