Environmental Initiative awards Saint Paul Hotel



On May 22, the Environmental Initiative awarded Saint Paul Hotel the Sustainable Business Award for their Organics Recycling Program. In partnership with the Ramsey/Washington County Resource Recovery Project, the Minnesota Waste Wise Foundation, the Minnesota Chamber of Commerce, and Troje's Trash and Recycling, the Saint Paul Hotel launched a very successful organics recycling program last year. As of

January 31, 2014, more than 350,000 pounds of food waste and other compostable materials has been diverted from the waste stream and delivered to a composting site in the Twin Cities metropolitan area. Read about other award winners and nominees.

The first of six citywide cleanups a huge success!

On Saturday, May 17th more than 450 residents showed up to recycle appliance, electronics, mattresses and scrap metal at the first of six citywide cleanups this year. As part of the city's new "All In" program, the citywide cleanup events enable residents to properly dispose of large refuse items, recycle materials not collected in the curbside program, and share usable goods with others.

Over nine tons of electronic waste were collected for recycling.
