

Existing Conditions






Existing Conditions

- Street width 78 feet
 - 33 feet in each direction
 - o 12 foot median
- 25 mph speed limit
- 3,600 vehicles per day (2018)
- Metro Transit Bus Routes 84, 46, 134


















Future projects

- Summer 2022



- St. Paul Avenue Resurfacing -Edgcumbe to Cleveland (2022)
- County led
- Will look very similar to this project – on street parking will be retained, add bike lanes
- Look for engagement opportunities later this summer

Planned changes





Resurfacing of pavement

- Often called "mill & overlay"
 - Grind off top two inches of pavement
 - Repave with bituminous asphalt
- Improves ride quality for people biking and people driving
- Extends the life of the road without a costly reconstruction





Pedestrian improvements

- ADA compliant pedestrian ramps where missing
- Curb extensions (bumpouts)
 - Narrow the roadway to calm traffic and reduce driver speeds
 - Provides a shorter crossing distance of roadway and improves visibility for people walking




- Curb extensions (bumpouts)





Pedestrian improvements – midblock Davern W 7th





Bike Plan Context




Existing Bicycle Network, April 2021



Fig 4. Planned Bicycle Network, 2015 Saint Paul Bicycle Plan




St. Paul Ave - typical cross section

- Only removed as part of the mid block curb extensions





ST. PAUL AVENUE RESURFACING PROJECT

Project Details

Description

St. Paul Avenue between Edgcumbe Road and West 7th Street will be resurfaced through a process called "mill and overlay" to create a smoother roadway surface for people driving and riding bikes. Crews grind off the top layer of roadway, then replace it with a new layer of bituminous pavement.

After new pavement is replaced, the road will be restriped with on-street bike lanes in place of a vehicle travel lane in either direction. These are consistent with the adopted 2015 Saint Paul Bicycle Plan. The bike lanes will improve safety and comfort for people riding bikes.

Pedestrian crossing improvements will also be installed at Davern Street, West 7th Street, and midblock between Davern Street and Edgcumbe Road. There will be a limited amount of on-street parking removed at these pedestrian improvement locations.

The City is also working in partnership with Ramsey County on their project on this street. Find more information about the Ramsey County project at: ramseycounty.us/StPaulAveResurfacing.
