Recycling Guide



DO NOT PUT RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC BAGS



PLASTIC CONTAINERS

Empty and rinse. Replace caps.

Bottles and jugs:

- Water, soda, and juice bottles
- · Milk and juice jugs
- Shampoo, soap, and lotion bottles

Cups and containers:

- Pudding and fruit cups
- Cottage cheese and yogurt tubs
- Clear plastic produce and clamshell containers

NO: #3, #4, #6, #7 or black plastic, plastic bags, plastic film/ wrappers, Styrofoam™, or containers larger than 3 gallons



METALS Empty and rinse.

- Food and beverage cans
- Aluminum foil and trays
- Pie tins and decorative tins smaller than 3 gallons
- Empty aerosol cans

NO: Paint or spray paint cans, propane cylinders, or helium tanks



PAPER AND BOXES Flatten boxes.

- Office paper, magazines, newspaper, and books
- Corrugated cardboard
- Cereal, toiletry, and shoe boxes
- Cardboard pizza delivery boxes

NO: Shredded paper, paper egg cartons, paper plates, napkins, or frozen food boxes



GLASS

Empty and rinse. Remove caps.

Food and beverage bottles and jars

NO: Drinking glasses, window glass, ceramics, or mirrors



CARTONS Empty and rinse. Replace caps.

Milk cartons

- Iuice boxes
- Soup, broth, and wine cartons

NO: Paper or Styrofoam™ egg cartons or ice cream cartons

These items should not be put in recycling or garbage containers. They can be harmful to the environment when not handled properly, cause damage to equipment, and injure employees at waste processing facilities. Options for proper disposal are listed below.

No Household Hazardous Waste, Batteries, and Propane Tanks

These items are dangerous because they can start fires in trucks or processing facilities. Find a drop-off location at **RamseyRecycles.com/HHW** or for additional battery disposal locations, visit **call2recycle.org/locator**.

No Electronic Waste

It is illegal to dispose of electronic waste, such as TV's, computers, and cell phones in the recycling or garbage cart because many of these items contain hazardous materials. These items may qualify for collection under the City's Bulky Item Collection Program. For more information contact your garbage hauler, drop electronic items off at a Citywide Drop-Off event, or visit **RamseyRecycles.com/AtoZ**.

No Construction Materials

Construction, demolition, or building materials cannot be put in your recycling or garbage cart. Find locations for disposal at RamseyRecycles.com/AtoZ.

No Medicine

Safely dispose of expired and unused medication for free at the Ramsey County Law Enforcement Center. Protect our environment by never flushing medication down the drain or disposing of it in the garbage. Find information at RamseyRecycles.com/Medicine.

No Needles or Syringes

Place empty needles and syringes in a hard-sided plastic container with a screw-on cap and label it "Sharps." Bring your closed "Sharps" container to a Ramsey County Household Hazardous Waste site at **RamseyRecycles.com/HHW.**

Cardboard Recycling

All cardboard must be flattened and fit loosely in your recycling cart. If you have large amounts of cardboard, you can bring it to the Recycling Drop-off Center.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

If a container has the words "Caution," "Warning," "Danger," or "Poison" on the label and still has product inside, it does not belong in the garbage or recycling. Use Ramsey County's free Household Hazardous Waste collection sites for safe disposal.

A free year-round HHW collection site is available at 5 Empire Drive, Saint Paul. For hours, visit RamseyRecycles.com/HHW.

Product Reuse Center

Choose to reuse when starting your next household project. Materials that are still in usable condition, like paints, automotive fluids, and household cleaners, are available for free at the Product Reuse Center. Same location and hours as the Ramsey County Hazardous Waste site. To learn more, visit **RamseyRecycles.com/HHW.**

Drop-Off and Disposal Options

Citywide Drop-Off **Events**

Saint Paul partners with local district councils to organize annual Citywide Drop-off events. Residents can recycle and properly dispose of large items and electronics at Drop-off events. For information, visit stpaul.gov/drop-offs.

Plastic Bags and Film

Do not place any plastic bags, bubble wrap, or film in your recycling cart. Avoid using plastic bags by bringing reusable bags to the store. Clean and dry plastic bags



and film can be dropped off at grocery or retail stores for recycling. To find a drop-off location, visit plasticfilmrecycling.org.

Food Scraps (Organics) Recycling

Reducing food waste saves money and reduces pollution. Learn more at stpaul.gov/foodwaste.

Collecting food scraps (organics) at home for composting is also a great way to reduce waste and recycle more! Saint Paul residents can drop off food scraps at one of seven sites throughout the City. Find locations, starter kit information, and a full list of acceptable materials at stpaul.gov/organics.

Fix-It Clinics

Attend a Fix-it Clinic to learn how to repair small household appliances, clothing, and more! Volunteers help residents troubleshoot problems and fix items. Find details at RamseyRecycles.com/FixItClinics.

Resources for Apartment Managers and Tenants



Multi-unit property owners are required to provide recycling opportunities for tenants.

Multi-unit recycling is funded through an annual fee that is collected with the Ramsey County property taxes. The annual recycling fee is \$38.16 per unit for properties with 4 units or more. The fee supports residential and public space recycling collection, a recycling drop-off center, carts and dumpsters, and education and outreach.

The City of Saint Paul's recycling program staff are available to provide educational materials and technical support to set up service and/or increase recycling participation at no additional cost.

Small Apartment Buildings (5-11 Units)

Small apartment buildings typically share two large (96 gallon) recycling carts that often need to be moved on the collection day. They share a collection day with surrounding residential homes. That schedule can be viewed at **stpaul.gov/collectionmap.**

Large Apartment Buildings (12+ Units)

Large apartment buildings will recycle in the location designated by their property manager. Recycling dumpsters or carts are available to be placed near each trash enclosure area. If you have questions about service-related issues, call Eureka Recycling at 651-222-7678.

Improve Recycling

To help reduce problems with recycling collection and improve program participation, the following resources are available to apartment managers:

- Education tags are used to identify specific problems with cart or dumpster use, such as access, placement, or unacceptable materials.
- Educational posters, handouts, signs, and presentations. Posters and handouts are available in 10 languages.
- Small, in-unit recycling totes or reusable bags for collecting recyclables.
- On-site technical assistance to address and solve problems.
