

Capital City Bikeway Network Project Overview



The Capital City Bikeway aims to enhance the outdoor vibrancy of Saint Paul by making it more accessible for biking, walking, running, driving, and using transit. New bikeways, trails, and sidewalks have proven economic and health benefits. Reconstructing and modernizing some of downtown's oldest streets, will allow for better experiences for pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists.

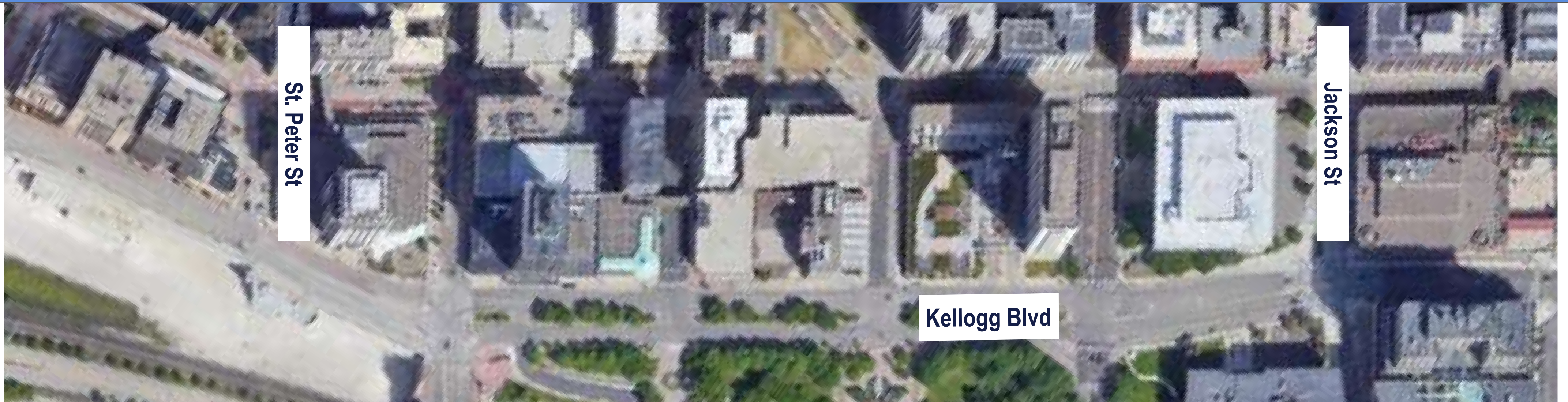
A portion of the south corridor of the Capital City Bikeway along Kellogg Boulevard from St. Peter Street to Jackson Street will be constructed in 2023.

Capital City Bikeway: Kellogg Boulevard Project Design

Before



- » No dedicated bike facilities
- » Parking lane on north side from St. Peter to Wabasha
- » Three vehicle lanes in each direction, from Wabasha to Jackson
- » Longer pedestrian crossings at intersection, with sight lines obstructed at medians
- » Minimal stormwater treatment

After



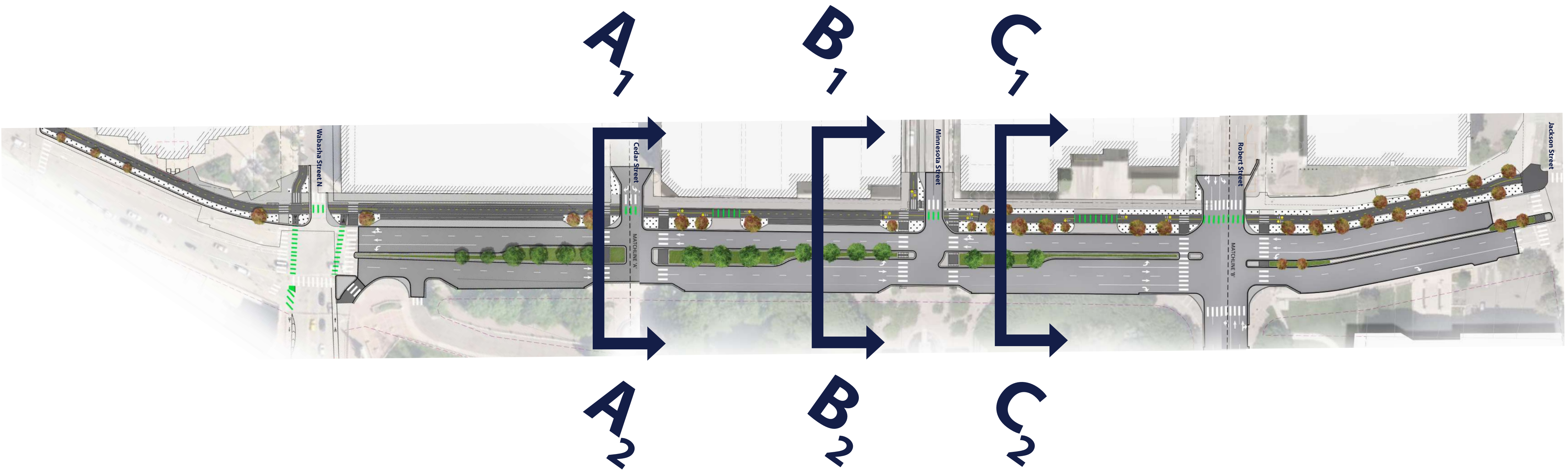
- » Dedicated 2-way bike lane along north side of street
- » Parking lane from St. Peter to Wabasha replaced with bike trail
- » Two vehicle lanes in each direction from Wabasha to Jackson
- » Center medians shifted south and replanted with new trees
- » Shorter pedestrian crossings at intersections
- » Pedestrian refuge areas in medians at intersections
- » New dedicated left-turn lanes at intersections
- » Dedicated bus drop-off zone in front of school
- » Enhanced legibility of vehicle lanes from Robert to Jackson
- » Underground stormwater filters

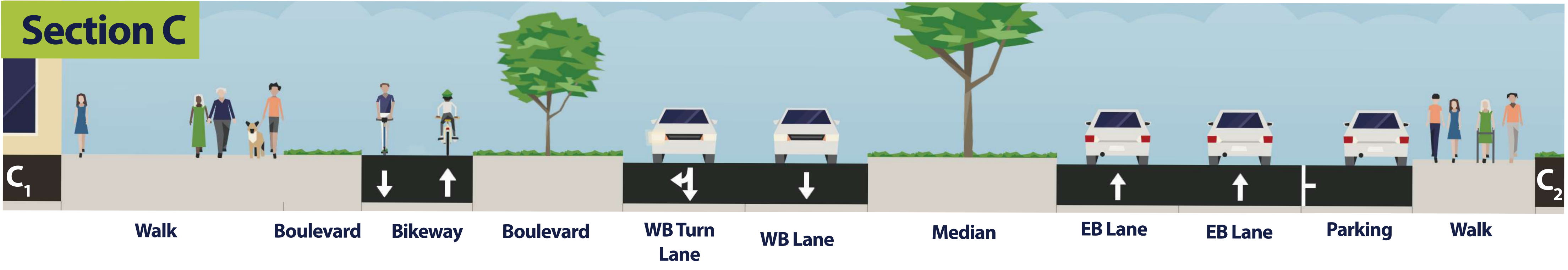
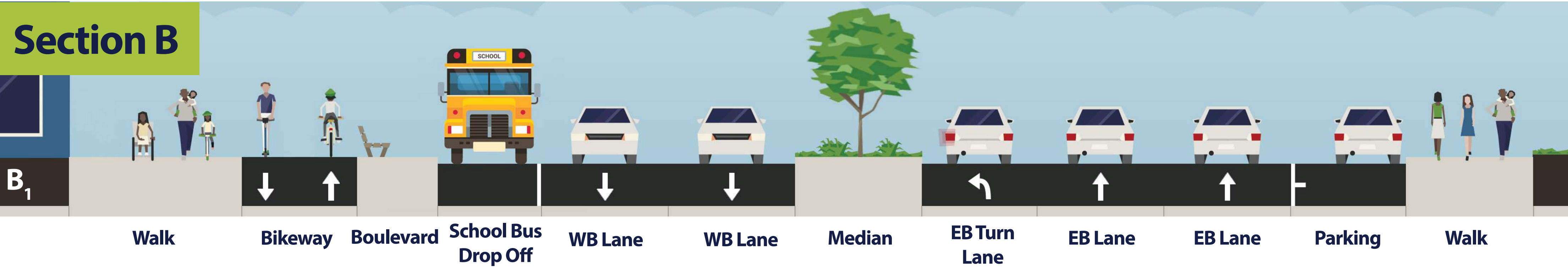
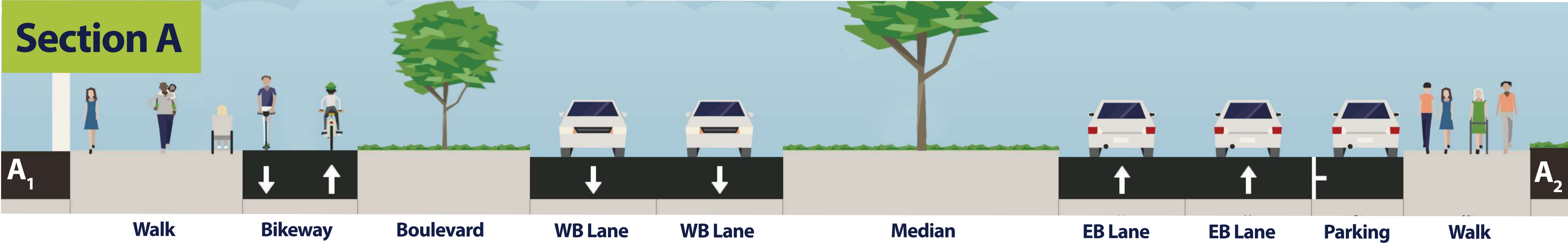


Capital City Bikeway: Kellogg Boulevard Streetscape Sections

How should we separate the bikeway from the sidewalk?

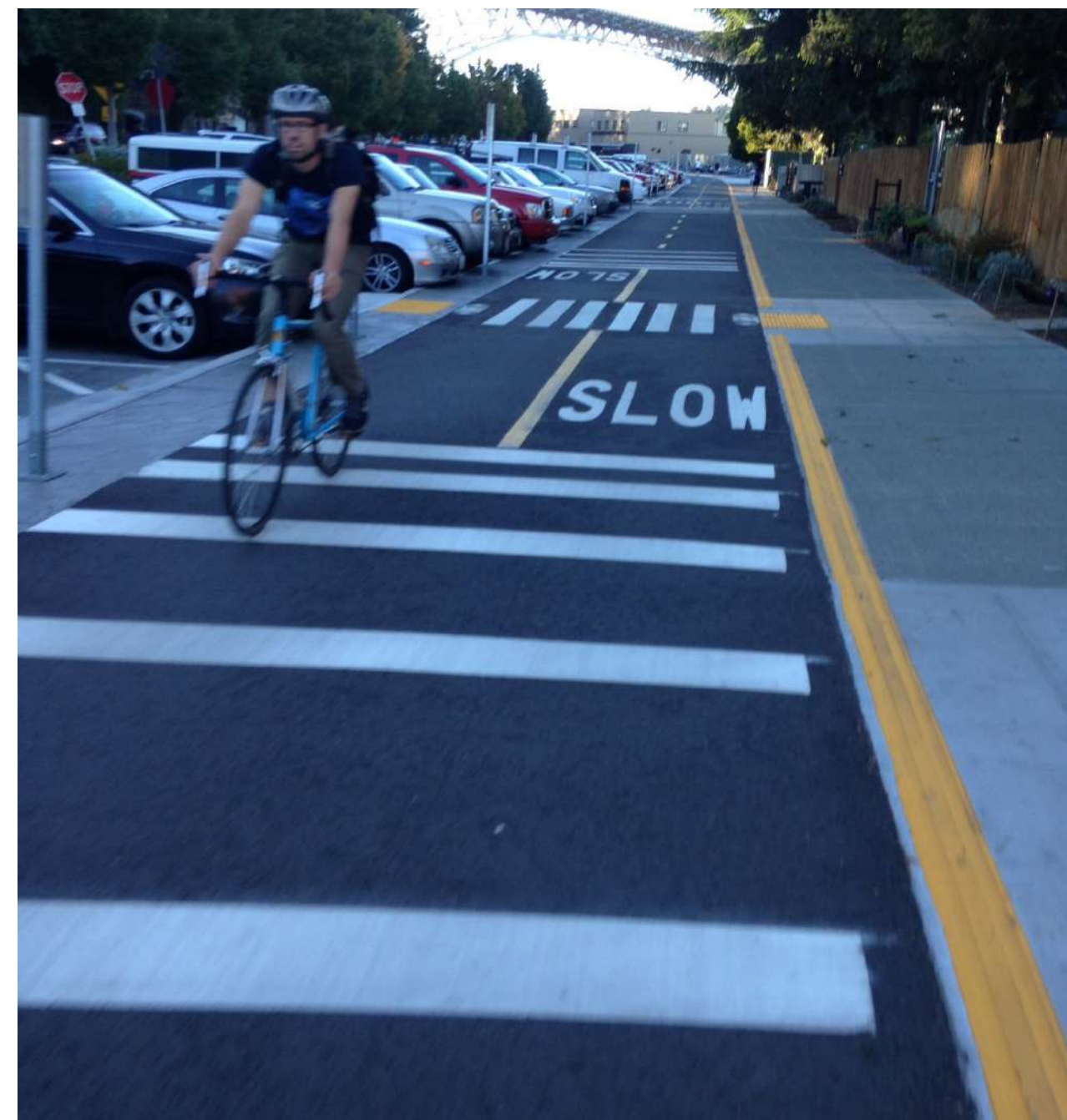
Separation between the bikeway and sidewalk is important for pedestrian and bicyclist safety.



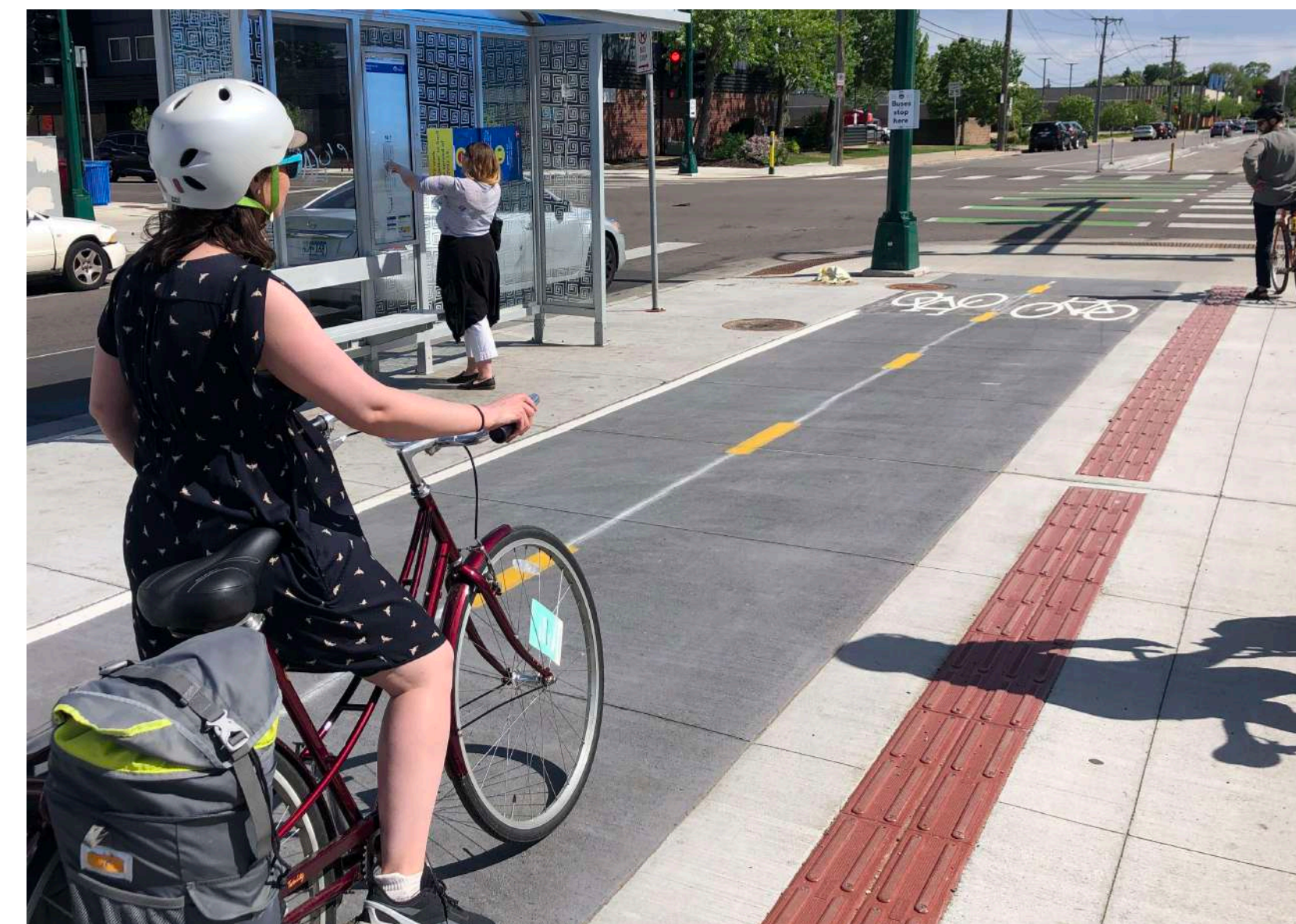
— Raised Curb

— Tactile Strip

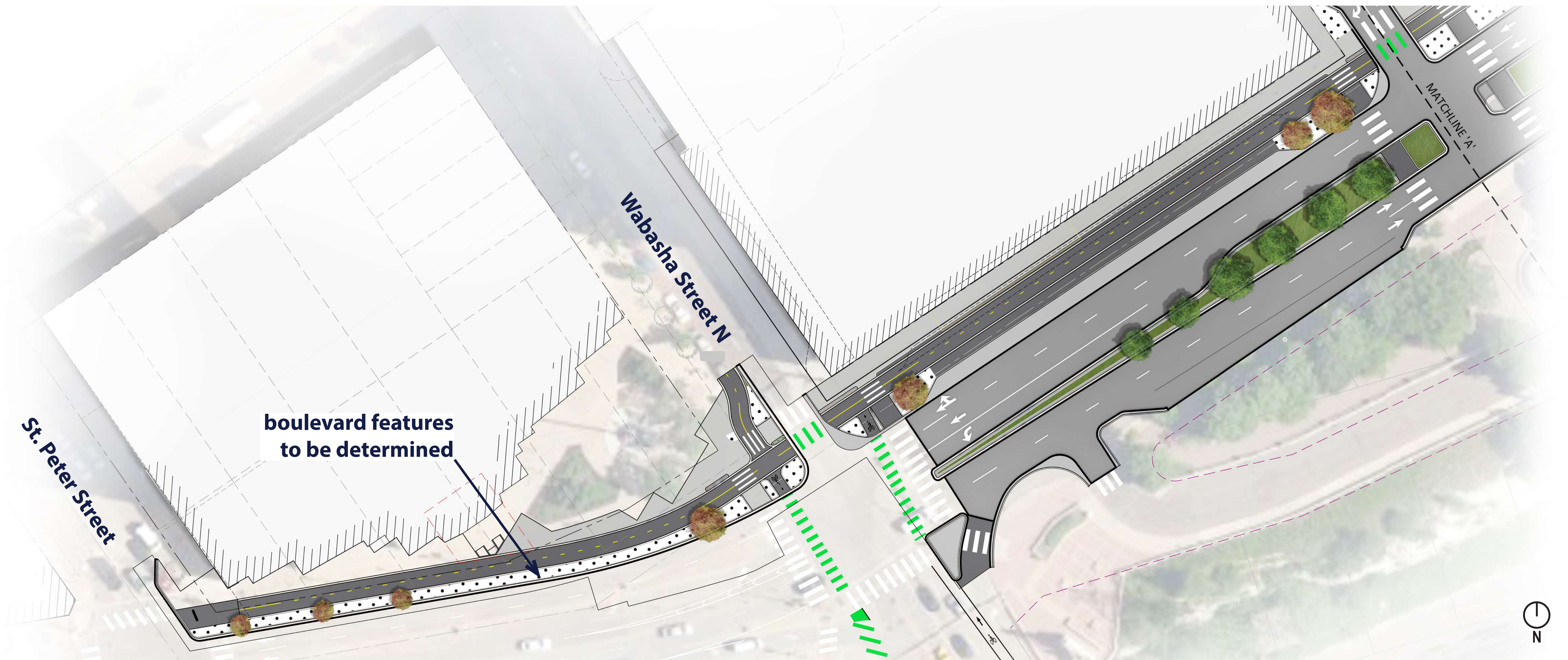

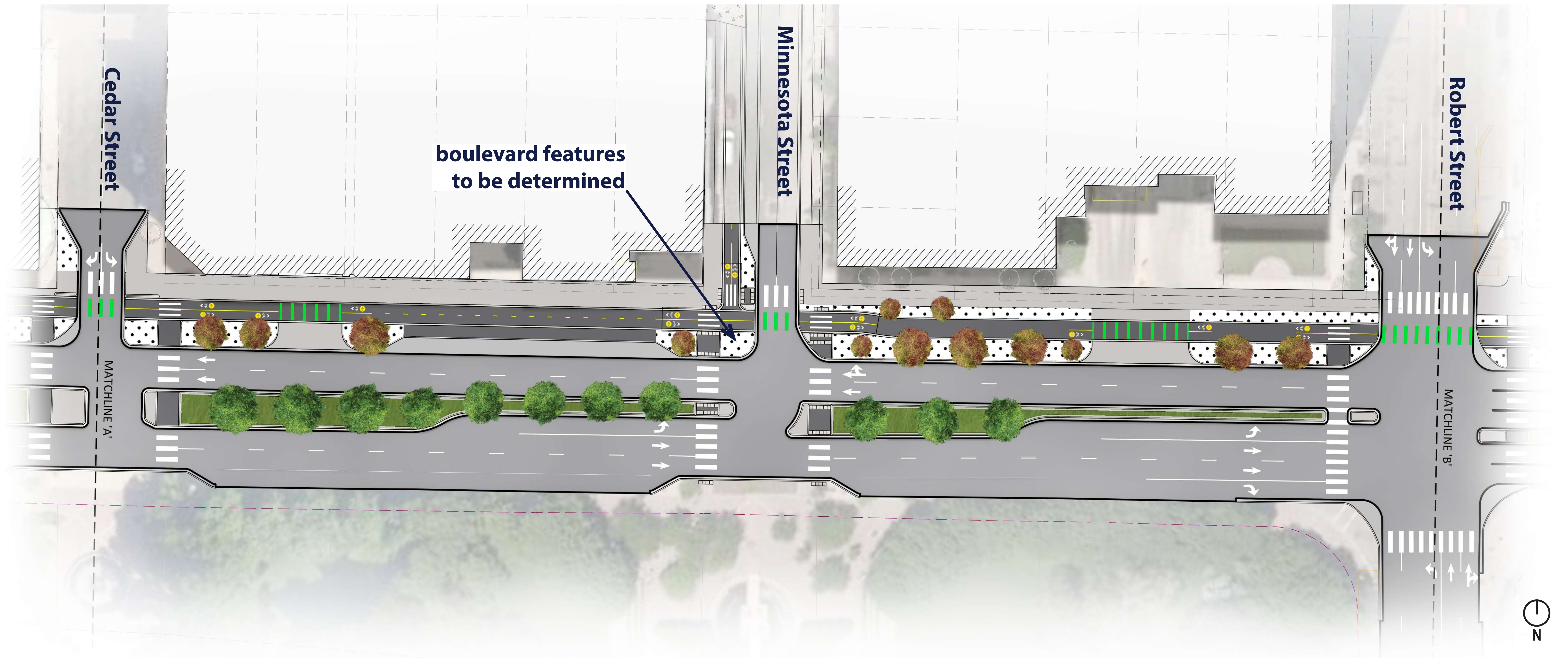
Capital City Bikeway: Kellogg Boulevard Landscape

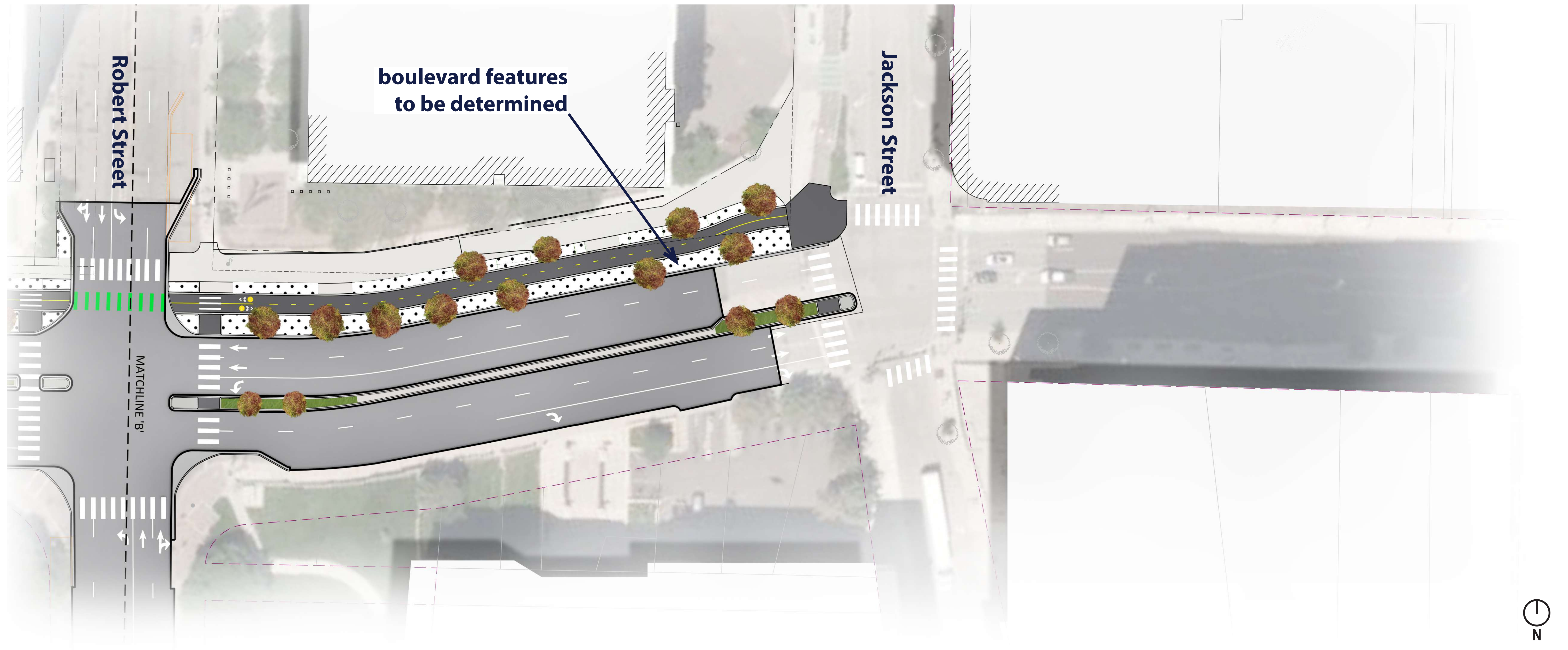

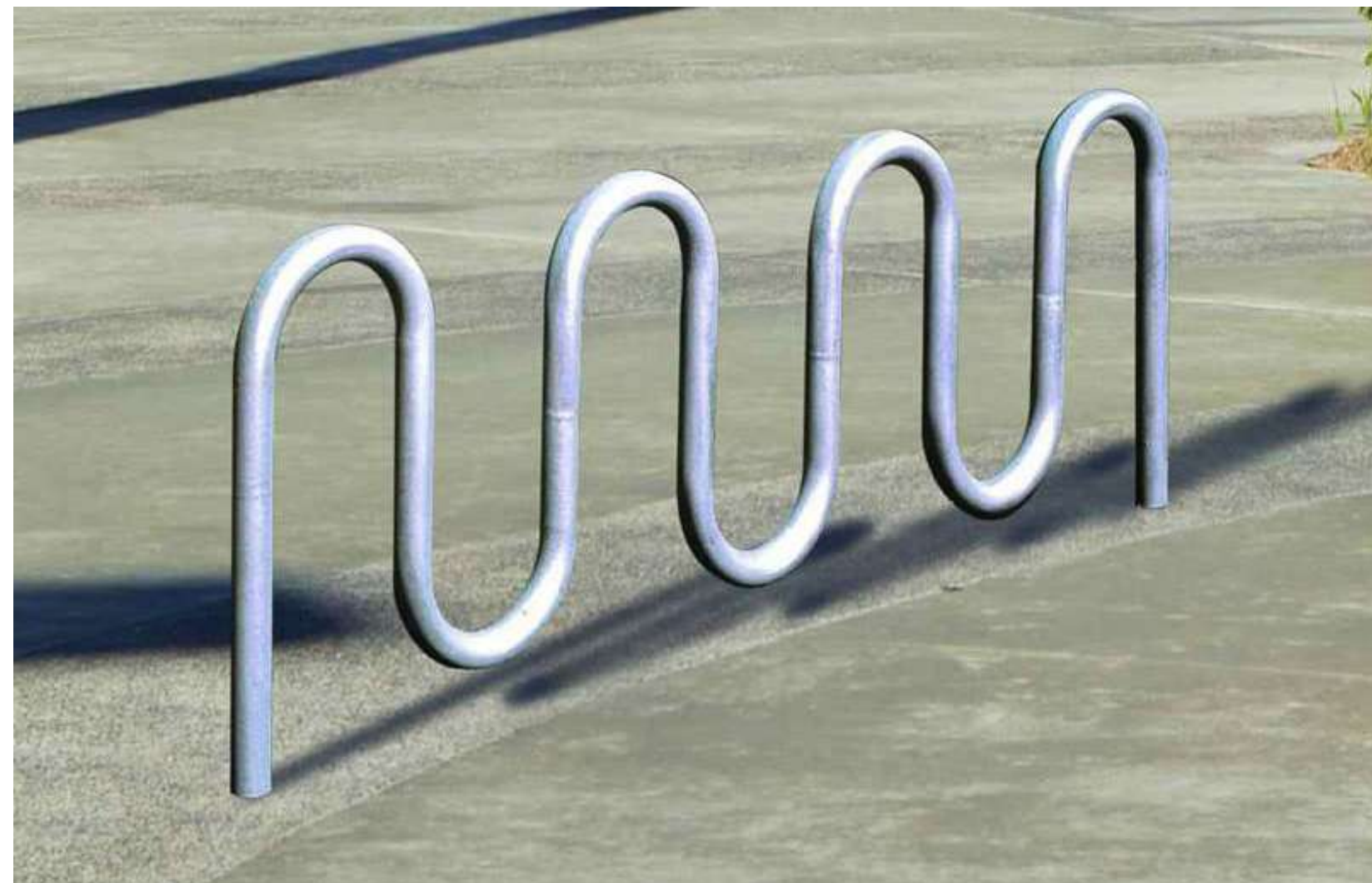
