

PUBLIC NOTICE

In accordance with 24 CFR 91.105(c)(2), and broader federal regulations relative to adoption of expedited citizen participation for U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Planning and Development Program, the City of Saint Paul (City) is making substantial amendment to its 2022 Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan which was approved by HUD on May 25, 2022.

Public Comment Period and Process:

The Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan amendment is available for a 30-day public review and comment period from August 25, 2022 to September 24, 2022. Citizens wishing to submit written comments during the public review and comment period may mail them, postmarked no later than September 24, 2022, to the following:

Substantial Amendment:

This substantial amendment concerns adding a new project, Public Facility: 296 7th St W to the PY2022 Annual Action Plan. The substantial amendment also increases the CDBG Resources available by \$2,859,331 in previously received, unanticipated program income. \$1,891,262 of the funds will be allocated to Goal 3 Rental Housing Rehabilitation and Project 8 Multi-Unit Rehabilitation. The Goal and Project outcomes will both be increased by 30 households. \$968,069 will be allocated to Goal 10 Public Improvements and Project 14 Public Facility: 296 7th St W. The Goal and Project outcomes will be increased by 82,620 persons.

Background on the Consolidated Plan:

The Consolidated Plan and associated Annual Action Plans describe the housing and community development needs, as well as activities to address those needs through the City's programs, as defined and funded by HUD. As required by HUD, the Consolidated Plan brings together, in one (1) consolidated submission, the planning and application aspects of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency
