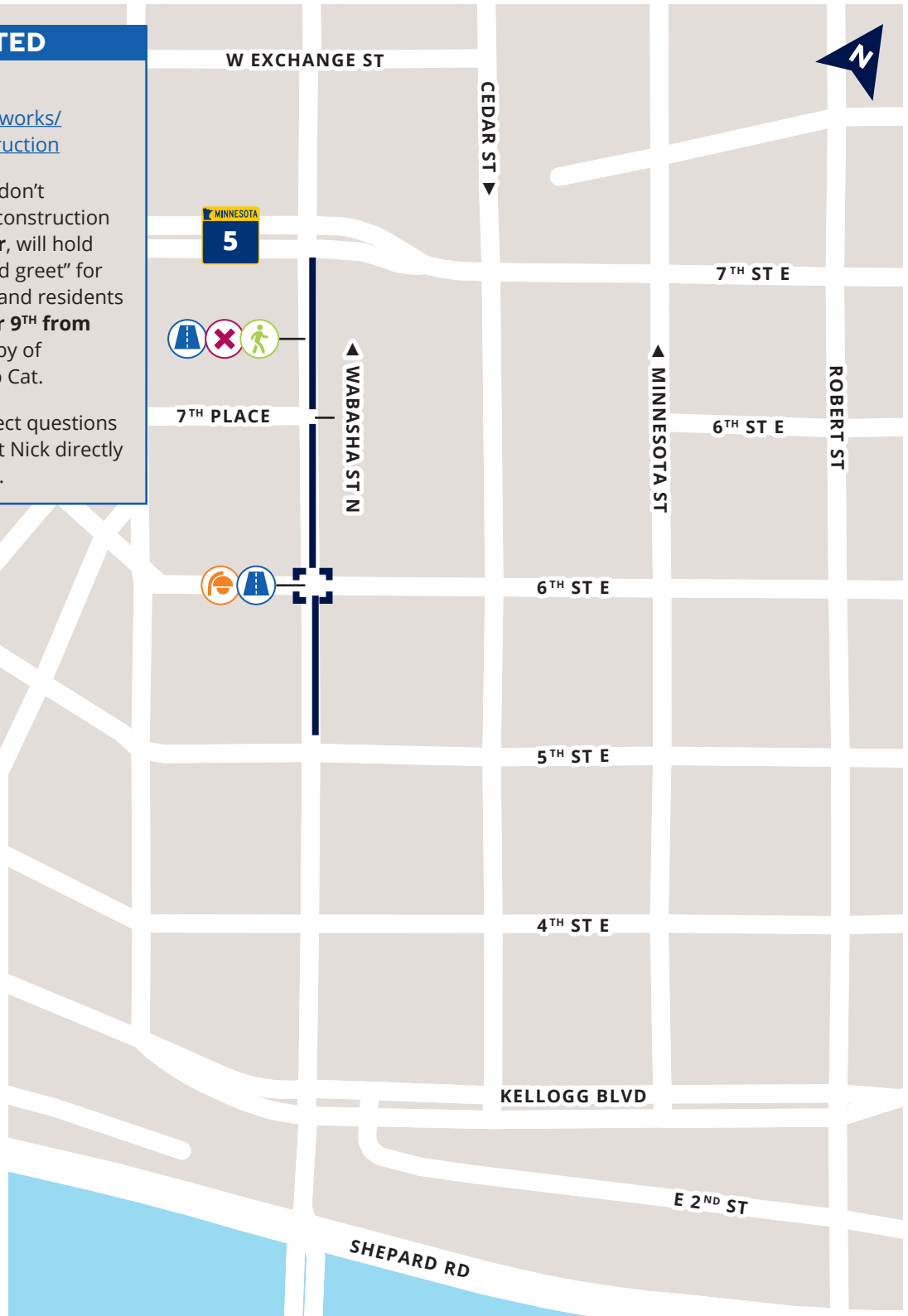

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

- Wabasha Street will be reconstructed to replace the roadway pavement, sidewalks, curbs, and underground utilities including water and sewer.
- The Capital City Bikeway will be installed on the west side of Wabasha Street in conjunction with this project.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- A single lane of Wabasha Street will be open from Kellogg Boulevard to 7th Street. Anticipate intermittent construction traffic to mingle with this lane as we finalize our work.
