

PUBLIC NOTICE

In accordance with 24 CFR 91.105(c)(2), and broader federal regulations relative to adoption of expedited citizen participation for U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Planning and Development Program, the City of Saint Paul (City) is making substantial amendment to its 2021 Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan.

Public Comment Period and Process:

Substantial Amendment:

This substantial amendment incorporates changes to program year 2021 Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan by adding the City's draft HOME-ARP allocation plan. The City was awarded \$6,789,929 to address critical needs for homeless assistance and supportive services through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

Background on the Consolidated Plan:

The Consolidated Plan and associated Annual Action Plans describe the housing and community development needs, as well as activities to address those needs through the City's programs, as defined and funded by HUD. As required by HUD, the Consolidated Plan brings together, in one (1) consolidated submission, the planning and application aspects of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency
