

PUBLIC NOTICE

In accordance with 24 CFR 91.105(c)(2), and broader federal regulations relative to adoption of expedited citizen participation for U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Planning and Development Program, the City of Saint Paul (City) is making substantial amendment to its 2021 Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan.

Public Comment Period and Process:

The Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan amendment is available for a 30-day public review and comment period from February 3, 2023 to March 5, 2023. Substantial Amendment:

This substantial amendment concerns decreasing Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding in the amount of \$247,825.01 from Goal #4/Project #7 – Single Unit Rehabilitation, decreasing funding in the amount of \$145,639 from Goal #8/Project #9 Economic Development, decreasing funding in the amount of \$56,355.45 from Goal #5/Project #3 - Neighborhood Non-Profits, decreasing funding from Project #12 – Planning and Administration. and increasing CDBG funding in the amount of \$470,503.30 to Project #1 – Acquisition Activities.
