**Transportation Safety Action Plan** 



### **Project overview**

The City of Saint Paul is developing a Transportation Safety Action Plan to identify and eliminate fatalities and serious injuries from vehicle crashes for everyone (pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, and drivers).

With community input, this plan will prioritize roadway and infrastructure projects that address safety challenges for residents of Saint Paul and support future funding opportunities for safety projects.

The plan will center the people and communities most affected by traffic-related injuries and fatalities—including pedestrians, bicyclists, and people in historically underserved communities—to improve safety for all users.



The City's goal is to reduce and eliminate traffic fatalities and injuries for everyone in Saint Paul.

Adopt a Transportation Safety Action Plan to prioritize transportation safety projects identified by Saint Paul residents.



Apply for Federal Safe Streets for All funding. If awarded grant, implement safety projects.



Determine physical infrastructure projects, strategies, and policies that address and reduce traffic crashes.



Improve how the City selects and designs future projects that improve transportation safety.

- Center equity in planning to include historically excluded communities of color to create a safer and more equitable transportation system.
