2023 Summit Avenue Pavement Treatment Project

Join us for a brief update in-person on August 10

July 27, 2023

Dear Saint Paul Neighbor,

The City of Saint Paul will address the current deteriorating street conditions along Summit Avenue from Lexington Parkway to Victoria Street and from Snelling Avenue to Mississippi River Boulevard.

The drive lanes will be patched and skim paved where needed and the bike lanes and parking lanes will be pothole patched where needed. Skim paving involves putting down a thin layer of asphalt over the existing surface to seal a larger section of the drive lanes in the street. After skim paving, on-street lane markings will be refreshed only where needed.

This project is strictly a street surface maintenance project to address the conditions of the roadway in the short-term. This work will not address any of the underlying road conditions or utility replacement or reconstruction needed. It will not repair, replace, or change any sidewalks, gutters, or curbs.

The street will remain open to traffic as much as possible during this process, but delays and short-term closures will occur when necessary.

Informational update drop-in:

On Thursday, August 10, Saint Paul Public Works will host a short in-person informational update about the pavement treatment project. There will be no formal presentation.

Project timeline:

Street maintenance work is anticipated to be completed by September 30, 2023.
