

RENT STABILIZATION

Landlord Worksheet Documentation of Increased Services

Introductory Information

A landlord is entitled to a fair return on rental property. Pursuant to the Rent Stabilization Ordinance, the City has established a process by which landlords can request exceptions to the limitation on rent increases based on the right to a fair return. The details of the process are available at stpaul.gov/rent-stabilization.

For various reasons, landlords increase the services provided to tenants. This worksheet is designed for landlords who are seeking an increase in the 3% annual rent cap on the basis of increased housing services but not other elements that would be considered in the Capital Improvement and Maintenance of Net Operating Income worksheet.

If requesting an exception by self-certification, the landlord must retain this completed worksheet for at least 3 years.

If requesting a staff determination, the worksheet should be sent to the city to be reviewed in coordination with other required documentation. The worksheet and documentation can be sent to the Rent Stabilization team by email at rent-stabilization@ci.stpaul.mn.us.
