RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING INFORMATION



The City of Saint Paul has installed Residential Permit Parking in various neighborhoods throughout the city. Permits are only available to residents and homeowners within the permit area.

Permit Areas are designated by "No Parking – Except Holidays – Except by Permit – Area Number" Street Signs. (Note: Signage may vary but all contain" Except by Permit"). The Area number on the street sign **corresponds to the Area on the Permit.**

RESIDENTIAL PARKING POLICIES & GUIDELINES

The following information is intended to help understand Residential Parking Permit Policies and Procedures. For more information go to www.stpaul.gov/parkingpermits

All vehicles are subject to the Posted Parking Regulations, regardless of Parking Permitted Only Area. (NOTE: Signage for each Area is on Maps found at www.stpaul.gov/parkingpermits

- Parking Area Numbers are Posted on Street Signs and must correspond with Permit Area on permit.
- Parking without a Permit, parking within a Permitted Parking Area different from what is posted on the street sign, or
 parking against Regulations on Signs, will be in violation and may be subject to ticketing, or ticketing and towing.
- Permits do Not guarantee users a parking spot, they only allow the holder to park a vehicle in the designated Permit Area.

VEHICLE PERMITS (stickers) - \$25.00 each (Allowed 3 per household/unit)

- Only available to Residents living within designated parking permitted areas and vehicles owned by Resident (Permit will become invalid if you move to a new residence within the same area.)
- Permit must be permanently affixed to outside of vehicle: outside vehicle on driver/street side rear/back seat window, lower right corner. (If not affixed correctly, vehicle may be ticketed).
- Motorcycles, affix the vehicle permit sticker to the left side of the gas tank, or the bottom right corner of the windshield when looking at the front of the motorcycle.

VISITOR PERMITS (placard) - \$25.00 each (Allowed 2 per household/unit)

- Available to residents, even if they do not own a vehicle.
- Must be placed face up on the driver's side dashboard with entire permit visible.
- Visitor permits are not meant to be used for extended stays (Misuse could result in tickets).

NON-RESIDENT OWNERS (placard) - \$25.00

• Available to Owners of Rental Property within Permitted Areas.

1 DAY HANGTAGS - \$3.00 each - (NO Hangtags will be sold July thru August - Renewal Season)

- Available to Residents Only (Application can be found at <u>www.stpaul.gov/parkingpermits)</u>.
- Hang tag renewal season is January thru December Current year Hang Tags will be sold until inventory runs
 out or until November 15 of the year they expire (No refunds or exchanges for unused, or expired hangtags).
- Monthly maximum is 20 hang tags per household (Must include Reason for Hang Tags).
- Hangtags CANNOT be used in Area 29 during the MN State Fair.

ADA DISABILITY PARKING

• People with valid ADA Disability Parking Placards or license plates may park in a residential parking permit zone without an additional vehicle or visitor permit.

CONTRACTOR and COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

- A Commercial or Contractor Vehicle, with Permanent Company marking. i.e. John Smith Plumbing, doing business in a permitted area, does not require a parking permit as long as they are performing a service.
- Magnetic or removable signs do not qualify as permanent marking.

HOME AIDES and SERVICE PROVIDERS

• Must use a visitor permit or 1-day hangtag provided by the resident.

REPLACEMENT PERMITS

- Must have a notarized letter stating how the permit was lost, damaged, or stolen.
- Replacements for lost, damaged, or stolen permits are \$25 each. Replacements for new vehicles are \$10 each.

Warning: False information on a permit parking application shall be grounds for denial or revocation of said permit(s) and is punishable as a petty misdemeanor. L.C. 164.10.b. The resale of any Residential Parking Permit (Visitor, Vehicle or Hangtag) is strictly prohibited under St. Paul Legislative Code Chapter 164. Abuse of this ordinance may result in losing your permit privileges for a year and/or a Misdemeanor charge through the St. Paul Police Department.
