Backyard Chicken Keeping Permit Application

Backyard Chicken Keeping Permit Instructions

Thank you for your interest in a **Backyard Chicken Keeping Permit**. The application and necessary documents are below.

Background: A **Backyard Chicken Keeping Permit** is required (St. Paul Legislative Code §198) for any household that keeps chickens. There are two tiers of Backyard Chicken Keeping Permits: Tier One: 1-6 Chickens, and Tier Two: 7-15 Chickens.

Saint Paul Residents may not own roosters or 16 or more chickens at any time.

Cost:

Process: Both Tiers require a completed application, site plan, payment, and annual inspection. Tier One Applications must document neighbor notification. Tier Two must supply a neighbor petition showing approval. You may also be required to provide proof of permission from the Heritage Preservation Commission (depending on your address), a building permit (if your coop is over 200 square feet), and an electrical permit (if you coop is connected to electricity).

To ensure timely processing of your permit request, please confirm that all paperwork is complete and accurate before submitting it. Incomplete application packets **will not** be accepted. Use the "Backyard Chicken Keeping Permit Checklist" to verify that all documents are ready to be submitted. Falsifying information is grounds for denial or revocation of a permit.

Saint Paul Animal Control strongly suggests that you contact our office to obtain a map showing the properties from which you will need to provide notification or obtain signatures. Payment: Cash, Check (payable to City of Saint Paul), Visa, Master Card, Discover, American Express

Effective April 3, 2021, a 2.49% service fee will be charged for all credit or debit card transactions and will appear as a separate transaction on your card statement. This fee is charged by the service provider the Department of Safety & Inspections uses to handle credit card transactions. The City will not receive any of the convenience fees.

If you keep other types of exotic or barnyard animals, you must also apply for a general Keeping of Animals Permit.

Backyard Chicken Keeping Permit Checklist

Application

- ☐ The application is completely filled out, including the questionnaire.
- ☐ Completed site plan.
- ☐ Electrical permit, if the structure will use electricity (contact the Department of Safety and Inspections at 651-266-8989).
- ☐ Building permit, if the structure is over 200 square feet (contact the Department of Safety and Inspections at 651-266-8989).
- ☐ **Tier One Only:** Completed "Neighbor Notification" Form
- ☐ **Tier Two Only:** Completed petition with verifiable signatures verifiable signatures from 75% residents within 150 feet of my property lines, on the same side of the street.

Heritage Preservation Zones

- ☐ Permission from the Heritage Preservation Commission has been given in writing if the permit includes external structures. (Required only if the address is part of a Heritage Preservation Zone.)

Payment

- ☐ Payment will not be accepted until all other necessary forms are submitted.

Inspection

- ☐ Inspection will be arranged after the site plan is approved by the Department of Safety and Inspections.

Tier Two: Neighbor Petition for Backyard Chicken Keeping Form

Instructions: Talk to neighbors within 150 feet of your property lines (on the same side of the street) and tell them you intend to keep 7-15 chickens. Ask that they sign the petition. You must obtain signatures from 75% of owners or occupants.

* Saint Paul Animal Control strongly suggests that applicants contact our office to obtain a map showing the addresses that fall within 150 feet of their property lines. You must obtain signatures from 75% of affected properties.

*If multiple unit buildings fall within the affected zone, contact Saint Paul Animal Control for specialized instructions.

*If you believe a property within the affected zone is vacant, contact Saint Paul Animal Control, (651) 266-1100.

Site Plan Instructions

Site Plan approval is required for all chicken keeping.

Setback and Location:

- Coops must be located in the rear yard and set back at least 5 feet from your property lines.
- No set back is required for pens or runs.

Size and Height: The size of the structure will vary based on the size and number of animals being kept.

- Each chicken must have at least 4 square feet of living area.
- Outdoor animal dwelling structures may not exceed 12 feet in height.

Other Permits:

- If electricity is to be provided for heating or lighting, an electrical permit must be obtained by the property owner or a licensed contractor.
- If the structure is larger than 200 square feet, a building permit must be obtained by the property owner or a licensed contractor.

Minimum Site Plan Requirements: Site plans are approved by the Department of Safety and Inspections, Plan Review and Zoning Division. A site plan is a drawing looking down on the lot, showing the dimensions of the lot, the house, garage, driveway, and existing buildings. The Site plan must include:

- The location and dimensions of the structure where the animals will be housed.
- The height of the structure.
- The type and location of fencing.
- The distance the proposed buildings are set back from property lines.

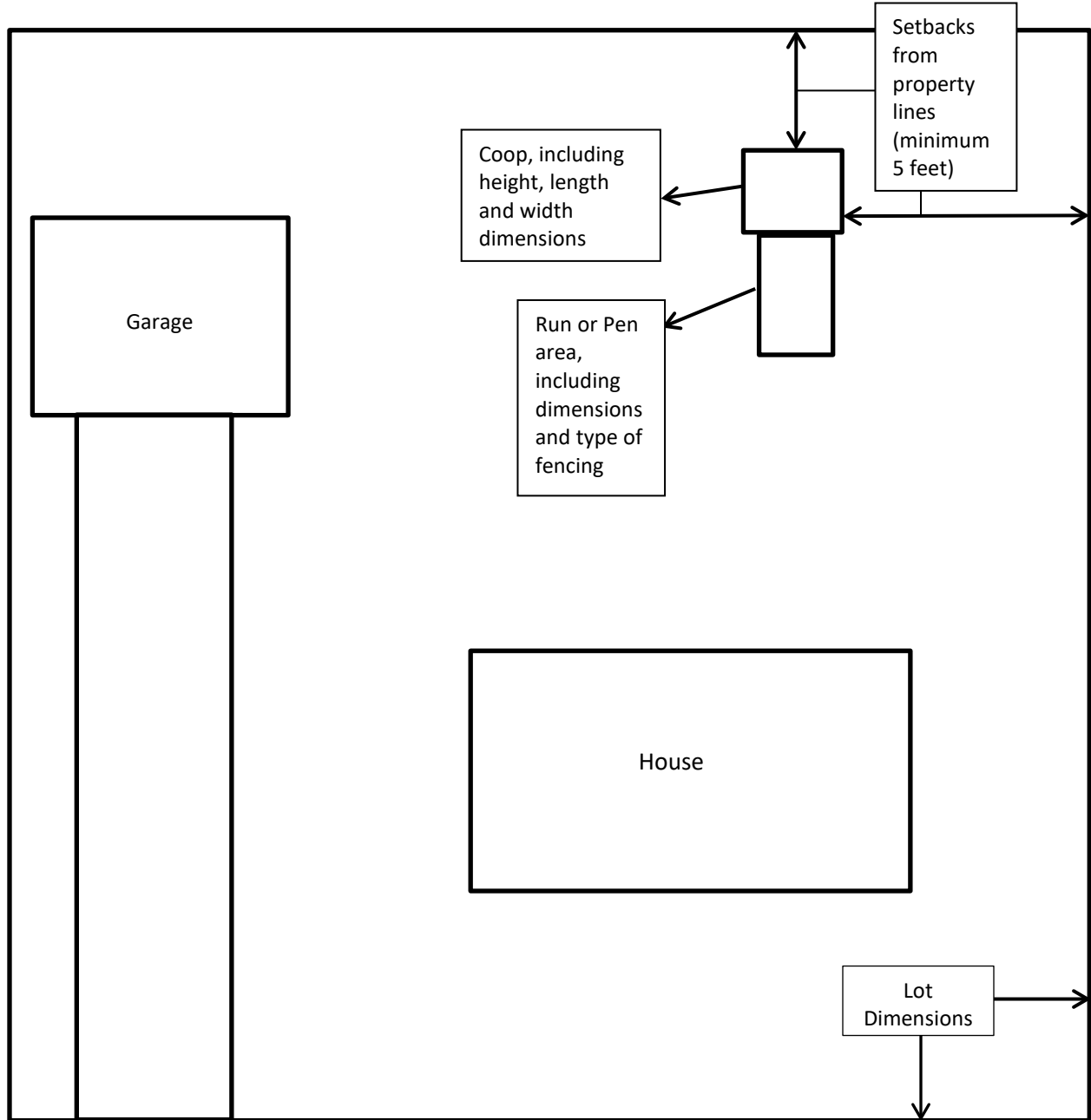
Tier One: Tier One allows you to have up to 6 chickens; however, if your coop is less than 24 square feet, you **must** write the maximum number of chickens you intend to have.

Tier Two: Tier Two allows you to have up to 15 chickens; however, if your coop is less than 60 square feet, you **must** write the maximum number of chickens you intend to have.
