The City encourages proposers and other interested parties to speak about 2026-2027 recommended CIB funding, and CDBG proposals at this meeting. To ensure that the meeting runs smoothly, speakers will be limited to two minutes each. Additionally, we encourage groups to nominate one or two representatives to speak on behalf of the group to minimize repetition.
