Dear City Leaders,

Thank you for the opportunity to participate in the recent hearing and to witness firsthand the care and deliberation that goes into stewarding public resources. Every funding application presents both complexity and promise—and this one was no exception. While the outcome may not have aligned with our hopes, the experience reaffirmed the vital importance of our work and the voices we are honored to represent.

At NeDA, our programs and services are shaped by the lived realities of hardworking and historically overlooked Minnesotans. We walk alongside families navigating financial hardship, housing instability, and generational barriers—offering not only services, but dignity, culturally rooted support, and a pathway to long-term stability. Our mission is not abstract; it's deeply personal to those we serve and to the team who shows up with unwavering dedication every day.

Participating in the hearing gave me a new perspective. It was a powerful reminder of the work ahead to ensure equity not just in outcomes, but in process and representation. I was struck by the absence of Latino voices at the decision-making table, and yet deeply proud to stand in the legacy of communities that continue to meet systemic challenges with resilience, advocacy, and care.

While I appreciated the opportunity to speak during the two-minute window, it was challenging to convey the full depth of our impact within such a brief format-especially amid visible distractions and moments that felt disconnected from the stories being shared. Still, I welcome this opportunity in writing to speak truth, to affirm that our voices matter, and to reflect on how we continue to show up-not just in pursuit of funding, but in pursuit of lasting, systemic change.

This experience has only sharpened my commitment to securing critical resources for our properties and programs—ensuring that families in our community not only have access to affordable housing, but also to dignified, welcoming spaces where they are seen, supported, and empowered. Our staff work tirelessly to walk alongside them, and we owe it to them—and to the families we serve—to continue advancing inclusive engagement and equitable opportunity.

I remain genuinely grateful for the service of each board member, and everyone involved in this process. I welcome continued dialogue and invite opportunities to learn and collaborate. Please keep me informed of future hearings and gatherings—I will make it a priority to be present.

Together, we share a responsibility to make our systems more just, more inclusive, and more responsive to those who need

them most. I look forward to staying in conversation as we work toward that shared goal.
