



## Temporary traffic calming demonstration project coming to your neighborhood this June

June 10, 2025

Dear Saint Paul Neighbor,

The City of Saint Paul will be installing a temporary traffic calming demonstration project on Baker Street between Cherokee Heights Elementary (Waseca Street) and Humboldt High School (Hall Avenue). It will be installed to improve bicycle and pedestrian access and safety on Baker Street and to demonstrate traffic calming infrastructure as part of a future bicycle boulevard. The Baker Street temporary demonstration project is part of the West Side Bicycle Boulevards Plan that the city is currently developing.

### When is the work happening?

On Friday, June 27, the temporary project will be installed on Baker Street. The project is planned to be in place until fall of 2026.

### What will be installed?

The city will install paint, plastic posts, and temporary curb along Baker Street to create:

- Traffic circle at Waseca Street and Baker Street
- Bumpout at Stryker Avenue and Baker Street
- Bumpouts at Hall Avenue and Baker Street

In addition, on Baker Street the city will paint bike symbols and arrows to designate shared bike and vehicle space.
