

The Saint Paul Healthy Homes program will address pre-weatherization (health and safety) and weatherization (insulation and air sealing) projects in qualified 1-4 unit owner-occupied residential properties.

The Saint Paul Power of Home program will replace gas furnaces, water heaters, stovetops, and clothes dryers with new, efficient electric equipment in qualified single-family owner-occupied homes.

#### **HEALTHY HOMES PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Living in a home that requires basic repairs and consumes excessive energy can cause significant stress and financial strain for families. Weatherization is the process of making a home more energy efficient by installing insulation and sealing air leaks. Some homes have health and safety issues, such as outdated and dangerous electrical wiring and asbestos, and those homes can't be weatherized until the issues are addressed. weatherization is the process of fixing problems that prevent weatherization from happening. The Healthy Homes Program of Saint Paul offers both weatherization (health and safety) and weatherization (insulation and air-sealing) services. The program targets qualified households that need critical repairs before weatherization can take place. By making these repairs possible, the program helps homeowners enjoy improved comfort, safety, and cost savings.









#### POWER OF HOME PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Power of Home Program of Saint Paul is designed to assist homeowners in electrifying their residences. Electrification involves replacing household equipment and appliances that use fossil fuels, like natural gas, with new, efficient, electric-powered alternatives. This shift can lead to healthier living conditions and increased comfort for residents. By using electricity instead of gas, households may also see a reduction in their utility costs. Eligible upgrades include equipment for heating, cooling, water heating, cooking, and clothes drying.



## **BENEFITS OF WEATHERIZATION**

Weatherization refers to a set of actions a homeowner can take to reduce the loss of conditioned air to the outside. These measures may include air sealing, insulating attics, walls, crawl spaces, and air ducts. Weatherization improves comfort, lessens health risks, and reduces heating and cooling costs. Weatherization can also reduce stress associated with high energy bills and even improve one's sleep.



#### **BENEFITS OF ELECTRIFICATION**

Electrification means fully or partially switching from equipment that burns natural gas or other fossil fuels to equipment that uses electricity. As electricity is increasingly produced from low-carbon sources such as wind and solar, shifting from technologies that use fossil fuels to those that use electricity reduces emissions.



New efficient electric household equipment, such as air source heat pump heating/cooling systems, water heaters, clothes dryers, and induction stove tops, can improve health by eliminating toxic chemicals associated with burning natural gas. Highly efficient electric equipment can also improve the comfort of the home and may reduce utility bills.



## **MAINTENANCE AND SERVICING YOUR EQUIPMENT**

With any new equipment, it is recommended to read the owner's manual after installation. It is also advised to speak with the installing contractor to ensure that you understand what maintenance is required on an annual basis.

Proper operation and maintenance will help save energy and ensure efficient performance when maintaining a heat pump. It is recommended servicing your heat pump at least once a year by a professional technician. Skilled professionals can offer the most reliable service and troubleshooting.

#### • Minnesota Housing Home Improvement Programs

Minnesota Housing offers a variety of loan programs to help make necessary repairs or updates to your home. Dayton's Bluff Neighborhood Housing Services provides rehabilitation and energy loans for home improvements on the East Side.

#### MISCELLANEOUS PROGRAMS

#### • **Project Safe Haven**: (651-224-7811)

With this FREE program provided by the Saint Paul Fire Department, you can obtain free smoke alarms, carbon monoxide detectors, and Stovetop Fire Stops. This program was created to help ensure households have working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.

#### • Evie & HOURCAR

HOURCAR provides a network of electric and fuel hub-based vehicles for round-trips as short as 30 minutes or as long as 3 days in the Minneapolis and Saint Paul Metro Area. Evie offers an all-electric fleet. Charging, insurance, and metered parking costs are included in the plan.

## • Capitol Region Watershed District (CRWD)

The Capitol Region Watershed District (CRWD) provides Native Landscape Grants to expand native landscape projects in its service area. These projects foster the expansion of native plant communities, provide pollinator habitat, and prevent stormwater pollution from entering our lakes and rivers.

#### • Lawns to Legumes

The Lawns to Legumes program offers a combination of workshops, coaching, planting guides, and cost-share funding (individual support grants) for installing pollinator-friendly native plantings in residential lawns.
