



Investing in Saint Paul: Jobs

Over more than 11 years as Mayor of Saint Paul, Chris Coleman has created thousands of jobs by making bold investments. He fought to get workers off the bench, and Saint Paul today is reaping the benefits of his strong leadership.

Private sector job growth in Saint Paul:

- Private sector job growth in Saint Paul, from 2015 Q1 – 2016 Q3¹: **5.3%**
- By 2020, Saint Paul is projected to have **more employed residents than ever before**

Green Line:

- According to the Metropolitan Council, employment along the Green Line is projected to grow by more than **90,000 jobs by 2030**
- Construction of the Green Line created **5,445 LRT construction jobs**, employing workers from more than 60 Minnesota counties
- Created **177 long-term operations and maintenance jobs** in the Twin Cities

Penfield redevelopment:

- **226,953** working hours
- Approximately **200 construction jobs**

CHS Field:

- **259,797** working hours
- Roughly **1,350 construction jobs**

Palace Theatre:

- **55,500** working hours
- More than **100 construction jobs**

Snelling-Midway redevelopment project:

- **Approximately 1,900** construction jobs are expected as a result of the soccer stadium at the Snelling-Midway site
- In the long-term, **more than 200 permanent jobs** are expected as a result of the soccer stadium alone

Ford Site redevelopment project:

- Once the full build-out of the Ford Site redevelopment is complete, planners estimate there will be **1,500 permanent jobs**
