City of Saint Paul Park Landscape Architects, Don Varney and Bianca Paz presented the second meeting for the renovation of Lower Landing Park.

Items discussed:

- 1. Project Scope
- 2. Summary of past meeting
- 3. Development of Two Concepts: Trail and Nature Oriented Program Active Recreation Program
- 4. Planning exercise: Compatibility of Uses Discussion.

The following are the observations and comments made by the meeting attendees:

Comments on Concept A: Trail and Nature Option

- Pump track should be close to the main trail to avoid bikers on the nature trail and keep the additional trail as, 'pedestrian only', to prevent conflicts of purpose.
- Label the native vegetation as educational resource for people to learn about planting options.
- Public art should be interactive and kids should be allowed to climb on the art piece
- Public art should be interesting and related to the natural and human history of the site
- Seems to be in keeping with the existing history.
- No opposition to cleaning up and revealing the rip-rap stone edge.





• It is worth investigating on re-establishing a more prairie like planting.

Comments on Concept B: Active Recreation Programming

- Confirm the demand on recreational activities in downtown Saint Paul. "How do you know that soccer fields are wanted?"
- There is need for recreational activities for young people-other downtown parks are suffering from overuse.
- Important connection to Native American History at this site.
- The active concept seems to be heavily programmed.
- Concerns about having too many different activities in one place that may conflict with each other.
- Interest in Tennis/Pickleball court-as a senior activity
- Skate park is a good idea
- Pump Track mixed reaction. Could work if located carefully.
- Dog Park should be big enough for off leash dog area5 ac+/-
- The Park should serve the community around the park. Concerns about bringing more people and traffic to this site, especially with 'Team Sports' such as Soccer and Basketball=demand for more parking
