

PARQUE CASTILLO



CONCEPT PLAN A circle is the symbol of unity, wholeness, inclusion and infinity; this form inspires the geometry for the new design of Parque Castillo. A new circular pathway facilitates circulation throughout the park, creates a shared central space for community gatherings, and connects the new elements of the park: a play area, splashpad, seating, and pathways into the community. The concept plan creates an active zone at the north side of the park; the play area separates play space per age group and adds playful seating options. A splashpad plaza is added for water play and to create a flexible entertainment space when the water features are turned off. Entryways from Clinton Avenue are across from the field project. A picnic area is located near the splashpad. The stage remains in the center of the circle for informal performances.

- Walking 12 times around the circle is equal to a mile
- Existing shade trees to remain
- Bench and Park lighting
- Proposed bike rack location
- Existing Castillo monument
- Replace street trees and coordinate with Public Works on sidewalk repairs



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
