Landmark Trees

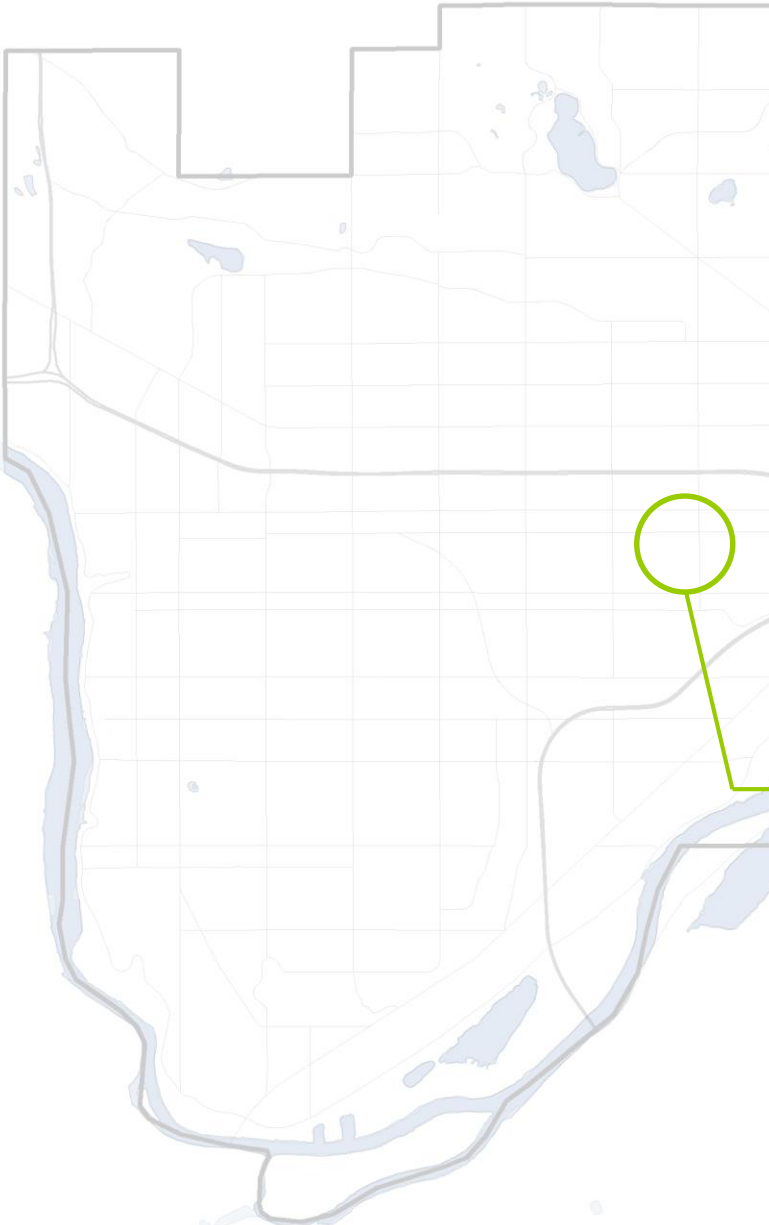


American Elm (*Ulmus americana*)

1201 Hague Avenue | District 13
Nominated by Leben McCormick

Diameter | 62" Height | 92' Crown Spread | 95'

One of the largest diameter boulevard American elms in Saint Paul. The picture alone does not give this majestic elm justice. Since 1999, this elm has continued to receive treatment against Dutch Elm disease. In addition to providing shade and wildlife habitat, it is currently home to a red-tailed hawk.

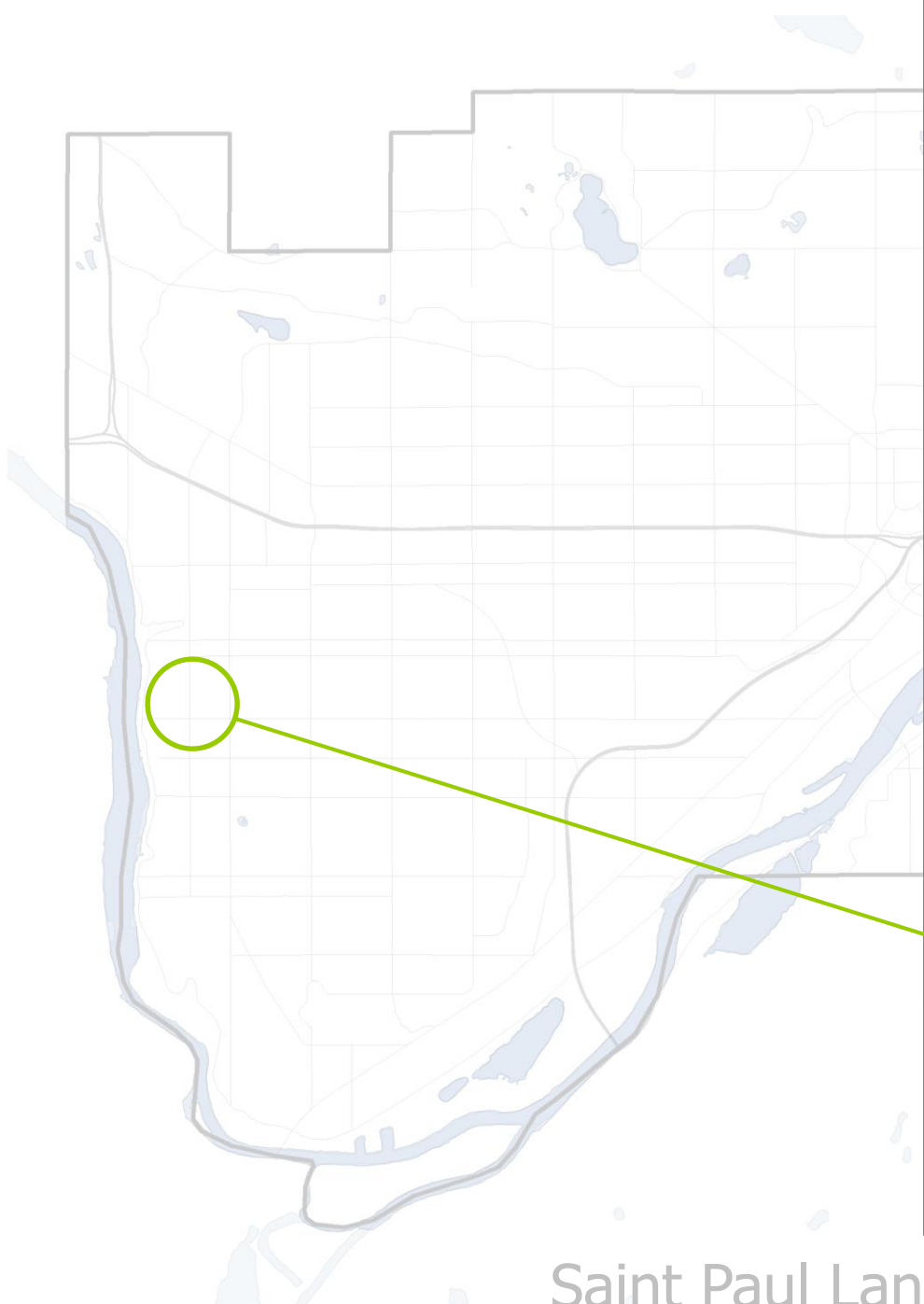


Bur Oak (*Quercus macrocarpa*)

Mississippi Market Co-op
622 Selby Avenue | District 8
Nominated by Mississippi Market Co-op

Diameter | 52" Height | 55' Crown Spread | 68'

This bur oak on Mississippi Market Co-op property was specifically protected during construction starting in 1998. The beautiful branching of this popular oak provides shade to many. This is a great example of preserving mature oak trees during building projects for future generations to enjoy.



Sugar Maple (*Acer saccharum*)

2200 Fairmount Avenue | District 14

Nominated by Cathy Brennan

Diameter | 39" Height | 65' Crown Spread | 61'

This private-owned tree has characteristic shaggy bark of a mature sugar maple—definitely beautiful and eye-catching. The dense foliage provides excellent shade. In the fall, the leaves turn a bright orange-yellow color.



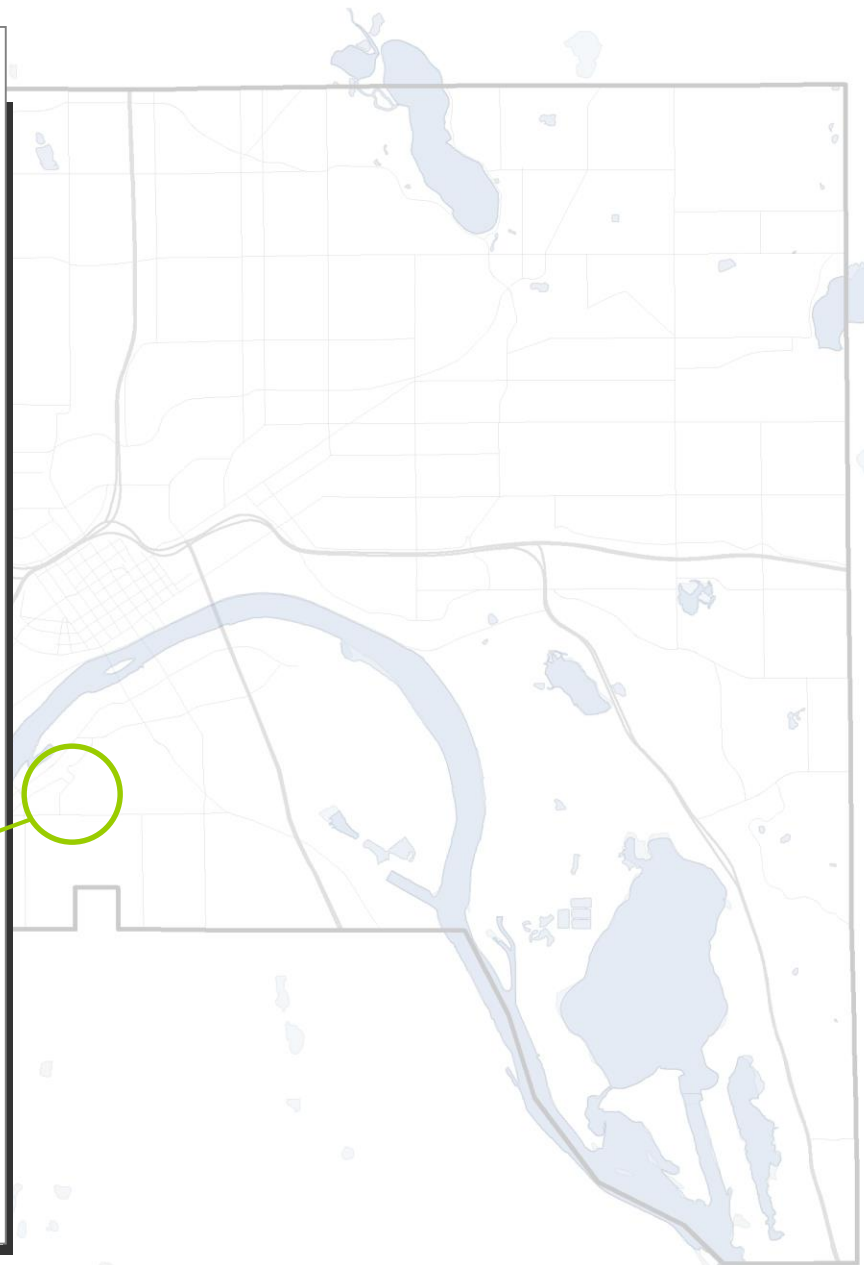
Green Ash (*Fraxinus pennsylvanica*)


Douglas Park | District 3

Nominated by Saint Paul Forestry

Diameter | 40" Height | 70' Crown Spread | 70'

This wonderful ash tree – located on the west side of Douglas Park – is a perfect example of a mature ash tree. It towers over the park and represents the importance of maintaining valuable ash trees. In 2018, this ash was treated to protect against Emerald Ash Borer.
