1. Estuary Plaza, overall view of part of the project for the St. Louis County Government Services Center. \$65,000 total. This was a re-imagining of the whole plaza from a brutalist featureless concrete expanse to a space with benches in wood and bronze and stone that incorporated 8 different bronze animals (including the beaver across the street). Zones were created for the sculptures using colored concrete and pebble paving.

2. Water Bench, from Estuary Plaza. Bronze, stone, colored concrete

3. Beaver in a pebble paved "pond," Estuary Plaza project.

4. Wood and stone water bench with bronze frog, Estuary Plaza project.

5. Iron Deer in the Steel Forest, steel in concrete footings. \$12,000 total. Arrowhead Library Association headquarters, Mountain Iron.

6, 7. Wheat Bench from Columbia Park Neighborhood Gateway project. The whole project was the creation of a one-acre park with many amenities, including community garden beds, benches, a picnic area, and crushed limestone paths. Overall cost was \$50,000, but this cast concrete bench with cast bronze wheat insets was about \$10,000.

8. Stoneware tiles with a vines motif from the Harriet Island Plaza project, Floodwaters. The Harriet Island Floodwaters project also included large bronze water forms in high relief. I'm including this so you can see that stoneware weathers well in this climate!

9, 10. Lake Superior Zoo, Memorial to the Barn Animals. \$9,000. These two animals, a babydoll ram and a pygmy goat, are portraits in bronze of two of the beloved barn animals who died in a tragic flood in 2012. The Zoo commissioned this as a memorial. Kids, as you can see, love them.
