2) Design Options

- a) Concepts
 - i) Concept A Existing container and tennis court remains
 - (1) Removal of existing play equipment and replacement with new equipment within existing container
 - (2) Minimal repairs/improvements to tennis court
 - (3) Additional ornamental railing along Laurel and Mackubin to define edge of play area
 - (4) Addition of picnic tables
 - (5) Replacement of site furnishings
 - ii) Concept B Expanded Play area and other park improvements
 - (1) Expand play area and offer a variety of play experiences including main play structure, swings and climber/spinner area
 - (2) Remove tennis court and define open space
 - (3) Additional planting area
 - (4) Addition of picnic tables
 - (5) Tree allee
 - (6) Expanded open lawn area
 - (7) Additional ornamental railing along Mackubin

Comments:

- In concept A, it would be nice to close off angled walk to Mackubin and open up the open lawn space
 - O The side entrance/walk on Laurel could be removed as well...it isn't that far for people to walk to get to the main entrance
 - o Add fencing so balls don't get into street
- Some of the trees are overgrown and block light at night. Explore trees thinning/removal to improve sightlines and effectiveness of site lighting. The blue spruce near the tennis court is overgrown
- Existing tennis court
 - Tennis court gets use as general 'open space' for activities such as whiffle ball, skateboarding, biking, or off leash dog run in addition to tennis activity
 - There are a lot of vines growing on the tennis court fence which has led to the decline of the tennis court
 - There is inconsistent maintenance with the tennis court system plan calls for removal of court and ongoing maintenance of court will not occur
 - The tennis court serves mostly two people at a time. This is not an efficient use of the space, but offers recreation opportunities for older adults
 - Discussed possible repairs to tennis court
 - One option is the use of Flexcourt product. City of Eagan uses this
 product on courts that are near the end of their useful life. Flexcourt
 allows them to get another 5-10 years out of a court. People
 commented they would prefer to repair existing court than use the
 Flexcourt material Parks will evaluate budget to determine

appropriate amount of investment in court repairs.

- The picnic area on concept A is in an area that doesn't get much use
 - Consider moving the picnic area to the area east of the play area this would provide better visibility to the play area
 - Question was raised about adding grills to park staff will review with budget
- Walking and pedestrian safety should be considered for those that walk between Selby and points south.
- There should be a four-way stop at the corner of Mackubin and Laurel Staff to follow up with Public Works on request
- The McQuillan historic sign to remain
- There could be 2 -3 picnic tables
- Is it possible to connect alley to the park? There is existing trees and landscaping along that edge and probably wouldn't encourage the connection.

Comments:

- Is there room for swings?
 - Concept A will not have adequate budget or space for swings or expanded playarea
 - It was suggested that the area at the front of the park could be used for swings.
- The online feedback showed people preferred traditional play equipment but the examples at the meeting show modern.
 - Feedback from the last meeting indicated there was an interest in the way the modern equipment kept the kids moving.
