








KAPO'ZA HISTORICAL MAP





WHAT IS A MASTER PLAN?

A master plan is a general plan or program for achieving goals and priorities.

DEFINING GOALS

Goals are priority project defining land use and programming.








DEFINING STRATEGY

A strategy is a plan of action designed to achieve goals and priorities.

GOALS & PRIORITIES EXAMPLE

Goal #1) Connect stormwater systems flowing into site through creative design that becomes a site amenity and educational opportunity.

- + Investigate best practices for stormwater management
- + Provide interpretation of stormwater systems
- + Explore wetland types and opportunities that result in healthy urban wetland
- + Explore creation of flowing stream





Lower Phalen Creek Project (LPCP) Swede Hollow Park Master Plan Survey



Age Group







HOW OFTEN DO YOU VISIT SWEDE HOLLOW PARK?






How often do you visit Swede Hollow Park?




HOW DO YOU ENJOY SWEDE HOLLOW PARK?






WHAT STORIES WOULD YOU LIKE TO SEE SHARED ABOUT SWEDE HOLLOW IN THE PARK?




What you LIKE most about Swede Hollow Park?






What do you think needs IMPROVEMENT at Swede Hollow Park?

What might limit your use of the park?




The majority of the responses in the other section weighed towards limited use due to flooding within the park, location (too far), and N/A.





Please select the potential changes that would most likely increase your use of the park?



What kinds of recreational programs or space would you like to see at Swede Hollow Park?




Cross country skiing was a popular response in the other category

SURVEY SUMMARY CONT.

TRANSFORM:

Improve park access. Activate the park through sustainable design, partnering with key stakeholders, and passive recreation and programming.

ENHANCE:

Provide enhancement to the unique *natural* environment, water quality, stormwater management, and wildlife habitat through natural resources management.

CONNECT:

Interpretation of the natural, historical, and cultural stories of Swede Hollow Park, and connection to the neighborhood and nearby parks.







Options to Daylight Phalen Creek

TRANSFORM ENHANCE CONNECT

1. PARK INTERPRETATION & SIGNAGE

- + Natural, historical, & cultural stories Migratory Bird Flyway, Dakota culture, Immigrants
- + Investigate strategic key location
- + Connection to other destination Bruce Vento Nature Sanctuary, Downtown Saint Paul, East Side Heritage, Hamm Park
- + Opportunity for creative public art

2. Access to Water

- + Daylighting Phalen Creek
- + Water quality with additional investigation on water source
- + Creative design by the water and education opportunity
- + Alternate trail type i.e. Boardwalk



3. NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

- + Removal of invasive species i.e. Buckthorns, green ashes, Siberian elm, & low quality vegetation
- + Enhance wildlife habitat i.e. Rusty Patched Bumble Bee, planting native plant species

4. VISIBILITY/SAFETY

- + Lighting
- + Emergency Beacon
- + Removal of low quality vegetation
- + Activating the park brings more awareness i.e. partnering with PED to activate north part of the park
- + Park Access

5. SPACE

- + Provide space to gather & events
- + Spiritual/Cultural healing space
- + Activating spaces with passive recreation & programming
