Work to reduce lead exposure in homes built prior to 1978 through support of lead identification and mitigation programs.	Housing	H-5
Improve indoor air quality by reducing exposure to mold, indoor tobacco smoke, radon, and soil vapors in homes to reduce asthma and address other health issues associated with air quality.	Housing	H-6
Ensure that programming and facilities support public health and personal improvement efforts, such as education, job training, and fitness and nutrition programs.	Parks and Recreation	PR-19
Maintain response readiness for emergencies related to water supply contamination or interruption.	Water Resources Management	WR-13
Collaborate with partner agencies on water quality improvement efforts, including capital projects and programming.	Water Resources Management	WR-14
