RE:	September 20, 2018 HPC meeting – Dayton's Bluff Pop-Up meeting survey results
DATE:	September 6, 2018

We held a Pop-Up meeting in the Dayton's Bluff Historic District at the Mississippi Market (740 East 7th Street) August community dinner on Thursday, August 23 from 5-7pm.

Commissioners and staff gathered public comment from residents via a survey. We had 101 responses which is a new record for a Pop-Up meeting. Here is a break-down of the results:

84 support preservation of historic structures or the job of the HPC 9 had no opinion or comments 8 did not support the HPC

Comments:

Doing wonderful job/Support the work of the HPC/Thank you HPC (multiple comments) Strengthens the character and sense of place for the city (multiple comments) We should keep historic structures The heritage of Saint Paul is priceless Too much has been lost, we need preservation It important, we don't want to become Minneapolis Preservation saved Dayton's Bluff-Thank you

Community needs to be informed of meetings Need less and easier to understand regulations Too many hoops to jump through/ Confusing-regulations don't make sense- hinder homeowners Too strict, unrealistic expectations and hurt low income homeowners
