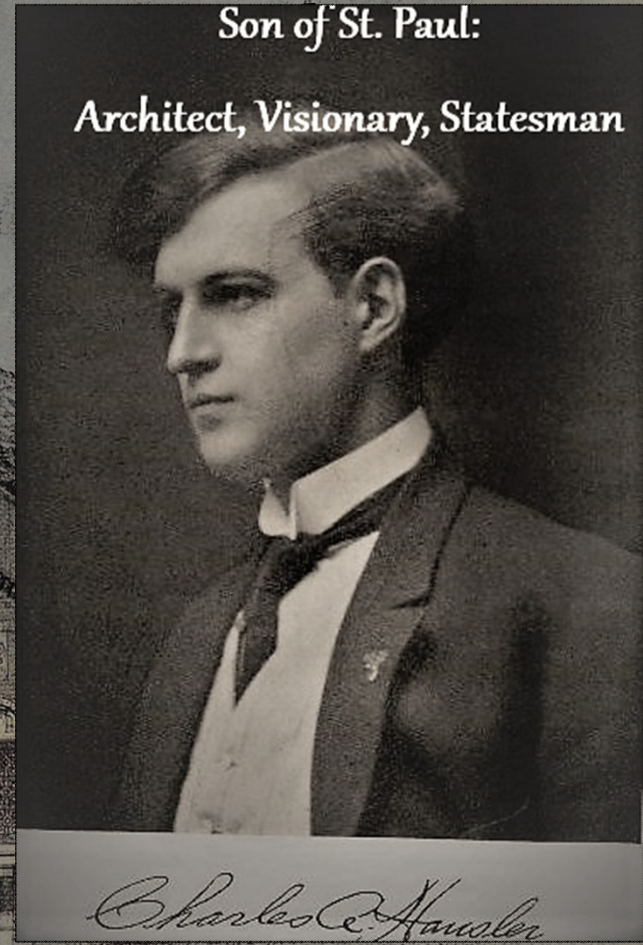

Building Code Revision Sought

A committee of three St. Paul architects has been named to work for revision of the present city building code, it was announced Saturday.

Appointment of P. C. Bettenburg, E. D. Corwin and Paul M. Havens, with Bettenburg as chairman, has been made by C. A. Hausler, president of the Minnesota Association of Architects.

Clarification and simplification of the code, and certain alterations to make it more adaptable to recent trends in building methods, has been suggested by building industry interests.

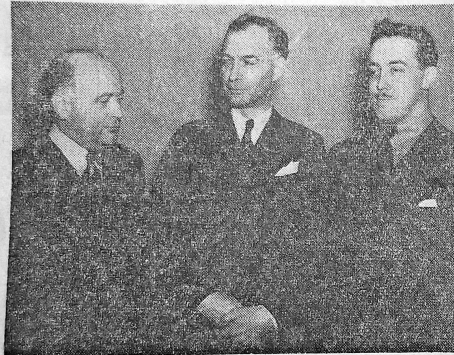
The architects committee will work in co-operation with similar committees of other interested groups, the announcement said.

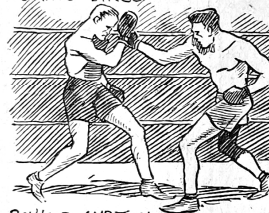
