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HISTORIC PROPERTIES ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT WORKSHEET (EAW) REQUEST FOR DETERMINATION OF THRESHOLD

Minnesota law requires that an EAW (Environmental Assessment Worksheet) be completed before the City of Saint Paul may issue any permits for the destruction, in whole or part, and the moving of certain historic properties. This requirement applies to properties which are listed on the State and/or National Registers of Historic Places which is not locally designated. Listed properties may include individual sites, districts (grouping of properties), objects and even landscapes.*Minnesota Statutes 116D.04 and Minnesota Rule 4410.4300 Subp. 31

For properties which are listed on the State and/or National Registers of Historic Places within the City of Saint Paul, the first step is for property owners to submit an application describing the proposed work with photos. Heritage Preservation staff will review the application to determine if the proposal meets the threshold and if further review is required.

<u>Register of Historic Places</u> criteria C (Architecture): That embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction.
