II. Approval of the Agenda

VI. New Business

A. Gold Line BRT Station Area Plans – Adopt a resolution providing comment to the Planning Commission. The Gold Line BRT generally runs along the north side of Interstate 94 in Saint Paul from Sun Ray to the intersection of Mounds Boulevard & Third Street East with Union Depot as the western terminus. (Boulware, 266-6715)

Commissioner Bezat moved to approve the Gold Line BRT Station Area Plans with the following changes in **bold**:

- **1.** Assessment of historic resources within the area of potential effect (APE) should be conducted prior to any decisions being made regarding BRT alignment, station locations, and station design.
- **2.** Property impacts to <u>all</u> historic properties should will be considered and shall be avoided in choosing a BRT alignment, not just impacts to <u>locally **designated**</u> historic properties.
- **3.** Buildings with historic character should be preserved in all station areas, including Sun Ray and the Sun Ray shopping center property.
- 4. Future recommendations and implementation should be consistent with the Historic Preservation chapter of the Comprehensive Plan and Chapters 73 and 74 of the Saint Paul Legislative Code. (HPC Staff will bring this back to the Commission for the August 13 Business Meeting for correction)

Commissioner Trimble seconded the motion. Motion passed 9-0.

VII. Chair Announcements

A. The HPC and Historic Saint Paul successfully organized a brown bag with panel discussion to discuss surveys yesterday afternoon at the Landmark Center.

VIII. Staff Announcements

- **A.** The Limestone Houses Thematic Nomination will be coming to the Commission for the August 13 Business Meeting.
