B. 412 Holly Avenue, Historic Hill Heritage Preservation District, for the abatement of a nuisance condition as declared by the Department of Safety and Inspections, Division of Code Enforcement. The property is a Vacant Building Category 3.

Based on the findings, the HPC concurred that the property has incredible historic significance and architectural value. The HPC recommended that 412 Holly Avenue should not be demolished and encouraged the City Council to delay an order to demolish the property and allow the owner time to undertake an option for rehabilitation, so the residence may continue contributing to the historic and architectural character of

the Historic Hill Heritage Preservation District.
