


• Learn about the proposal for bicycle lanes and parking strategies on Cleveland Avenue

## Process Background: Bicycle Plan

- Product of a 4-year planning effort (2011 – 2015)
- Significant public outreach and engagement was performed during the plan's development
- Substantial revisions were made to the plan to reflect the community input received





### **Project History:**

#### • April 2015

Bicycle lanes proposed for Cleveland Avenue between Summit Ave and Randolph Ave

#### • April 29, 2015

Open House held for Cleveland bike lanes

#### • June 17, 2015

City Council Public Hearing for Cleveland Ave bike lanes. Following a public hearing, the City Council voted to delay the implementation of bicycle facilities on Cleveland Avenue to allow for further community engagement and study of routing options

#### • August 4, 2015

The Ramsey County Board of Commissioners approves completing the mill and overlay work on Cleveland without bike lanes. Specifies that the County will revisit Cleveland Avenue pending the city's more comprehensive evaluation of a north-south bicycle route/

#### • August 12, 2015

City Council adopts a resolution approving a public process to identify a north-south bicycle route that runs from Randolph Avenue to University Avenue between Fairview Avenue and Mississippi River Boulevard.

- Tasked with making a recommendation to the City

### **Project History:**

Community Working Group:

- From September November 2015, the working group met 4 times, and hosted a Community Open House October 28, 2015
- The Community Working Group considered bike routes on Cleveland, Prior, and Finn
- On Monday, November 9, the working group concluded its work and voted to recommend that Cleveland Avenue be the designated bike route between Randolph and University
- Stressed the importance of parking mitigation.



# Project Overview:

- Following the recommendation of the Community Working Group, bicycle Lanes are proposed for Cleveland
- Parking would be removed from the west side of Cleveland between Myrtle and Randolph
- Highland Pkwy to St. Anthony Ave in 2016
- St. Anthony to University Ave at a later date



# Parking Mitigation:

- 8 Parking mitigation strategies are proposed
- Mitigation strategies include:
  - Changes to Permit Parking areas 16, 18, and 22
  - The addition of new timelimited parking
  - Construction of two half-block parking bays on Cleveland Ave

 City staff and the City Council will review the feedback on the proposed parking strategies and may update the proposed strategies based on your input.


