Plastic Containers

#1, #2, & #5

Bottles and jugs:

Cups and Containers:

- · Yogurt, pudding, and fruit cups
- Margarine, cottage cheese, other tubs, and lids
- Plastic produce and takeout containers

NO: #3, #4, #6 or #7 or black plastics, plastic bags, containers larger than 3 gallons, or Styrofoam[™]

Metal

Empty and rinse.

- Aluminum foil and trays
- Food, beverage, and aerosal cans
- Decorative tins and pie tins



Glass

Empty and rinse. Remove caps.

Food and beverage bottles and jars

NO: Drinking glasses, window glass, ceramics, or mirrors



Paper

- Mail, office, and school papers
- Newspapers (with inserts)
- Magazines, mail, and phone books



NO: Paper egg cartons, paper plates, napkins, paper towels, or coffee cups

Boxes

Empty and flatten.

- Cardboard
- Delivery pizza boxes
- Refrigerated food boxes
- Toiletry boxes
- Cereal, cracker, shoe, and gift boxes

NO: Frozen food boxes



Cartons and Cardboard Cans

Empty and rinse. Keep caps on.

- Milk cartons
- Juice boxes
- Soup, broth, and wine cartons
- Chip, nut, and other snack cans



NO: Paper or Styrofoam[™] egg cartons or ice cream cartons
