Sidewalk Construction is Happening in Your Neighborhood in 2020!

Randolph Avenue and McKnight Road Sidewalk Projects

What is happening?

The projects will add sidewalks and improve pedestrian crossings in your neighborhood. See the project map on reverse side.

When is it happening?

Sidewalk work is planned for July through October 2020.

How will the project impact you?

Please expect short-term disruption of travel ways by people, materials, and equipment. Full street closures are not expected; however, street parking will have temporary bans as the work is underway.

What's the cost?

The total *estimated* cost of this project is \$400,000. The project is funded by the city and by Ramsey County. There are no assessments for property owners.

PROJECT DETAILS

Sidewalks

Sidewalks will be constructed near the edge of the public right-of-way with a tree boulevard. ADA-compliant pedestrian ramps will also be constructed.

Parking and driveways

Please watch for temporary parking bans to allow construction crews to move in and out of your neighborhood quickly and safely.

Property owners who have driveways impacted by project construction will be notified in advance to any temporary access issues.

Existing boulevard gardens and sprinklers

If you have personal property, fences, plantings, or sprinkler systems in the public right-of-way, please remove them. Otherwise, they may be damaged during construction. The project will not replace or repair damages to property in the public right-of-way.

Trees in the boulevard

Because of Emerald Ash Borer, all Ash trees in the area will be removed. Additional tree removals may be necessary where they conflict with the sidewalk.
