

# Using Your New Cart!

Saint Paul has begun collecting recycling from wheeled, lidded carts. The recycling carts will provide more space for recyclable materials and help reduce litter by keeping items in the cart. Learn how to use your new cart and help us recycle more!



- Recyclable material is no longer accepted in the old blue bins, paper bags or other containers outside of the cart.
- All material must fit loosely inside your cart with the lid closed. Do not place extra cardboard next to your cart.
- Remember to remove your cart from the curb after collection.



To ensure the mechanical arms on the trucks can service your cart, please:



1. Place your cart along the edge of the alley or curb by 7:00 am with the arrows on the top lid facing out.
2. Leave two feet of space, if possible, between your recycling cart and other objects such as your garage, trash carts, trees, or fences. Do not place the cart on or behind any retaining wall, inside a fence or behind a cart.
3. Keep the cart clear of snow. Do not place in or on a snow bank, or in standing water (to avoid freezing to the ground in the winter).

## Cart Size Concerns?

If you have space constraints or need more volume, a smaller or larger cart is available after the 90 day transition period (April 16) by calling Eureka Recycling at 651-222-7678.

# Recycle all of these items together in your cart!

Place out by 7:00 a.m.



## Containers

Empty and rinse, labels okay

- Aluminum and steel cans; foil and trays
- Glass bottles and jars (*Remove caps*)
- Milk, juice and soup cartons (*Remove caps*)
- Most plastic food and beverage containers (*Empty, rinse, leave caps on.*)

**NEW: Round cardboard food containers!**  
(Pringles™, peanuts, etc.)

## Boxes

Flatten and empty

- Cardboard
- Delivery pizza boxes
- Boxboard (Cereal, cracker, shoeboxes, etc.)

**NEW: Refrigerated boxes**  
**toilet paper tubes**  
**and paper towel**  
**tubes!**

## Paper

- Newspapers (*With inserts*)
- Magazines, mail and phonebooks
- Office and scrap paper (*Put shredded paper in a closed, labeled paper bag inside the cart*)

## Clothes & Linens

Items must be clean and dry.

Place in a VERY sturdy plastic bag and fasten tightly!

Clearly label the bag CLOTHES & LINENS and place next to your cart on your collection day.

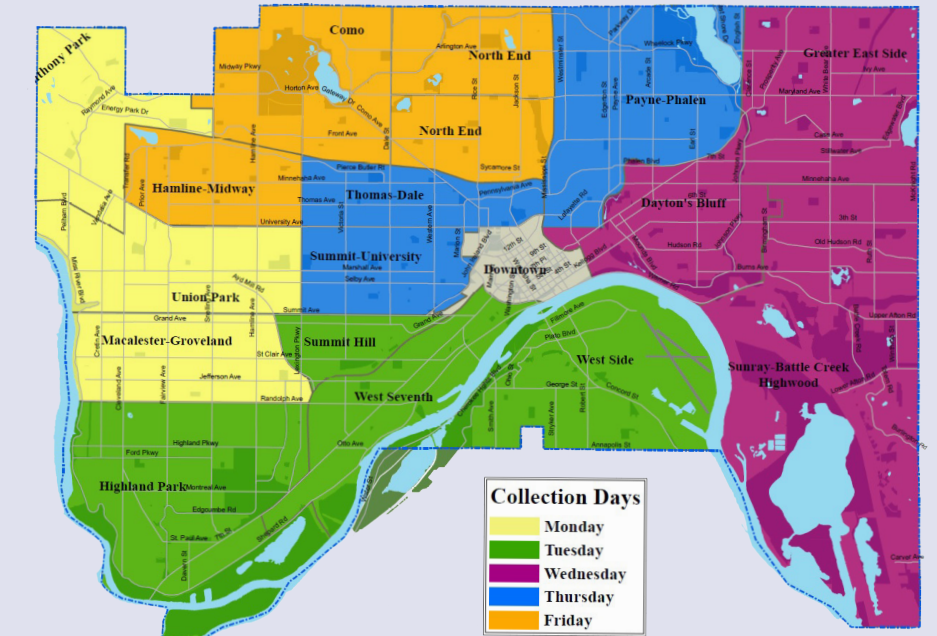

## Collection Days

Recycling in Saint Paul is collected weekly. New recycling collection days started on January 16, 2017. To find out your new collection day, visit [stpaul.gov/recycle](http://stpaul.gov/recycle).

Recycling collection will be delayed one day if it falls on or after the following observed holidays:

- Memorial Day
- 4th of July
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas Day
- New Year's Day
