ATTACHMENT REQUIRED: A site plan drawn to scale and dimensioned showing the layout of the lot including the placement of the house, accessory buildings, parking pads, and driveways must be submitted. Any proposed parking areas should be shown. If parking areas and driveways are not currently paved they will be required to be paved with standard or pervious asphalt or concrete, or with brick, concrete or stone pavers. Driveway pavement may be limited to wheel tracks at least two (2) feet wide.

Section 67.702. Student dwellings.

Within the SH student housing neighborhood impact overlay district, a student dwelling is a one- or two-family dwelling requiring a fire certificate of occupancy in which at least one (1) unit is occupied by three (3) or four (4) students. For the purposes of this article, a student is an individual who is enrolled in or has been accepted to an undergraduate degree program at a university, college, community college, technical college, trade school or similar and is enrolled during the upcoming or current session, or was enrolled in the previous term, or is on a scheduled term break or summer break from the institution.

Section 67.703. Standards and conditions.

- (a) A student dwelling shall be located a minimum of one hundred fifty (150) feet from any other student dwelling located on a different lot, measured as the shortest distance between the two (2) lots on which the student dwellings are located.
- (b) Parking shall be provided in accordance with the requirements of article 63.200 for new structures.

Section 67.707. Tracking and renewal of registered and established student dwellings.

All student dwellings shall have and maintain a fire certificate of occupancy that identifies the property as a student dwelling. Continued student occupancy is required and documentation of residents' student status may be required in the future.
