You may have noticed that for many years now, the property on 1179 SEVENTH STREET EAST was stagnant. The structures on that property are now in harsher conditions and beyond



repair. I am committed to building an East Side abundant in resources, businesses, and opportunity for people across race, class, gender, and age. Leaving this property as-is does not bring us closer to the future we deserve. That's why my colleagues joined me in voting to order the rehabilitation or razing and removal of the structures at 1179 SEVENTH STREET EAST. It's been a blast serving as Vice Chair of the Board of Water Commissioners and ensuring that everyone has clean, drinking water and more.
