



Each year, Saint Paul receives about \$9 million from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Consolidated Plan is required by HUD to prioritize these funds over five years. These programmatic funds are set by HUD and allocated to the City in three different pools:

- **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG):** Housing, public facilities and services, economic development, planning
- **HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME):** Expanding the supply of affordable housing for low- and very low-income persons
- **Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program:** Preventing homelessness and assisting those already homeless

The Consolidated Plan reflects strict HUD program requirements as well as policies adopted in the City's Comprehensive Plan. It aims to address housing, public facilities and infrastructure, economic development, and public service needs in the city related specifically to those HUD funds. This process also includes the Annual Action Plan (AAP) that acts as the City's planning document for the use of these funds during a single program year. The 2026-2027 Annual Action Plan is being implemented within the existing 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan.

The following table shows proposed project areas and associated HUD funding from the 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan. The City of Saint Paul expects to receive funding allocations in 2026 similar to its 2025 allocations: \$6,756,518 in CDBG funding, \$1,423,385 in HOME funding, and \$594,589 in ESG funding.
