

CITY OF SAINT PAUL, MN
PROPOSED HOME-ARP ALLOCATION PLAN AVAILABLE FOR REVIEW

In accordance with 24 CFR part 91, 24 CFR part 92, and CPD notice 21-10, the City of Saint Paul will have its proposed substantial amendment to HOME American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP) plan available for review and comment on April 9, 2026.

Saint Paul's HOME-ARP Allocation Plan was made through a substantial amendment to the program year 2021 Consolidated Annual Action Plan an approved by HUD in last amended June 25, 2026 .

Public Comment Period and Process:

An updated proposed substantial amendment to the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan is available for review during a 15-day public review and comment period from April 9, 2026 to April 24, 2026, at <https://www.stpaul.gov/conplan>. Citizens wishing to submit written comments during the public review and comment period may mail them, postmarked no later than April 24, 2026, to the following:

Substantial Amendment:

The proposed substantial amendment to the approved plan adjusts the budget to move all funds from the Non Congregate Shelter and Supportive Services categories and move to Affordable Housing Activities. An initial 30 day comment period for this amendment ran March 2 to April 1, 2026. This additional 15 day period is for a correction to the amendment that incorrectly did not redline the budget amount for \$50,000 in supportive services. This correction is noted in the updated draft.

Background on the Consolidated Plan:

The Consolidated Plan and associated Annual Action Plans describe the housing and community development needs, as well as activities to address those needs through the City's programs, as defined and funded by HUD. As required by HUD, the Consolidated Plan brings together, in one (1) consolidated submission, the planning and application aspects of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) programs.
