

Rondo Streets Study

June / July Engagement Summary



SAINT PAUL

Study Overview

The City of Saint Paul is developing a community-led vision for street improvements within the Rondo neighborhood and adjacent areas. As part of the City's commitment to the Rondo neighborhood to have the vision for street improvements reflect the needs and wants of Rondo residents, the City is partnering with Community Based Organizations (CBOs) such as the JK Movement and 825 Arts, as well as District Councils to facilitate engagement with a diverse and representative audience. Information about the study is also being shared with community members through other CBOs.

June marked the end of Phase 1 Engagement for the study, which was focused on community members vision for travel throughout the neighborhood. In July, Phase 2 Engagement began, which is focused on co-creating what the future could look like, with consideration of feedback received during Phase 1.

Below is a summary of engagement conducted during June and July. The list below does not include one-on-one coordination meetings with CBO and District Council staff for upcoming events.

June / July Engagement Events

825 Arts and Saint Paul Parks and Recreation "The Get Down" Pop Up - June 21, 2025 at Central Village Park

The project team popped up at "The Get Down" hosted by 825 Arts and Saint Paul Parks and Recreation and shared information about the study to approximately 30 people. Attendees could provide input on the study through an in-person voting exercise.




Walk N Roll #1 - July 8, 2025 at Rondo Commemorative Plaza

The project team hosted a group walk and bike ride event, where participants traveled around the neighborhood learning about street design and providing input regarding their preferences for street design and roadway elements. After the walk / ride, community members could provide additional input through an in-person voting exercise. Approximately 15 people participated.



Walk N Roll #2 - July 29, 2025 at Central Village Park

The project team hosted a second group walk and bike ride event, with a similar format as the first event. After the walk / ride, community members could build their dream street through a puzzle exercise. Approximately 20 people participated.




Lexington-Hamline Community Council Ice Cream Social - July 20, 2025 at Hamline and Hague Park

The project team popped up at the Lexington-Hamline Community Council Ice Cream Social and shared information about the study to approximately 10 people. Attendees could build their dream street through a puzzle exercise.

Youth (K-6) Studentship - July 9, 23, 30, 2025 at Jimmy Lee Recreation Center

Youth (7-12) Studentship - July 10, 17, 24, 31, 2025 at Jimmy Lee Recreation Center

The project team, in collaboration with the JK Movement, conducted a studentship program for elementary, middle, and high school aged youth at the rec center to explore urban planning, street design, engineering and landscape architecture. Throughout the program students went on field walks to assess existing conditions, designed improvements for existing streets, and designed their own visionary street.

The project team will be popping up at community events and hosting experiential events to collect input and feedback on the study in the coming months. As events are confirmed they will be posted on the study website.
